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Annual Report, Senior Pastor

Once again God has been good to SCFBC!

General Fund

In the midst of one of our nation's worst financial downturns God has both resourced and motivated our church family members to give generously to the ministries of SCFBC. This fact combined with good financial prudence on the part of our staff and lay leadership meant that giving in 2009 to our General Fund **exceeded** our expenses by **\$6,786.80**.

As I have talked to other pastors in our region I've repeatedly heard of cutbacks, layoffs and a general decrease of ministry capacity. Not so with us. We continued to perform ministry at our normal pace and accomplished much for the Lord. The specific ministry leaders will tell their stories in the pages that follow.

Capital Fund-Raising Campaign/Renovation

In addition we decided to go all out with the Capital Funds Campaign we had begun planning for at the end of 2008. The initial response to our First Gifts Sunday and the three following Sundays saw **\$172,565** given **in cash**. Pledges given at that same time amounted to an additional **\$326,085**.

These pledges have continued to come in at a healthy rate. As of the end of January of this year we have only **\$105,348** remaining to be given. This has enabled us to move ahead with our improvements without interruption since we are able to "pay as we go."

Staffing Changes

Just as we entered 2010 there a few staff announcements that I need to mention.

At the end of January of this year Tammy Catterton stepped down from her position as **Children's Director**. Pastor Jenny has taken on her responsibilities and is working on a total makeover of this ministry. To shoulder this new role means she has relinquished some of her previous responsibilities. I will now share in the preaching at EDGE, assume staff responsibility for the Mission Team's work, and will help oversee our Life Group ministry. We will continue to work out the details as we proceed into this new year.

Also, we are beginning in earnest to find a **Director of Student Ministries**. This person will work with our Junior High, High School and College-Career groups with emphasis on the youth. While this will place an added burden on our General Fund expenses, we firmly believe it's time to add this vital ministry to SCFBC.

I look forward to seeing what new blessings God will give us to give to others in this new year.

Annual Report, Associate Pastor

Life Group leaders meet together each month for sharing, prayer and training.

lifeApps Wanting to assist our people in their growth towards maturity in Christ, a system of Life Classes for Sundays was developed and begun. The new Christian maturity program is called lifeApps, with multiple 5-week classes being offered each session. The lifeApps team includes Joel Robinson, Denise Stephens, Pastor Rich and Pastor Jenny. Classes offered this year included: *Who is God?* taught by Pastor Jenny, *Back to Basics* taught by Pastor Rich and Jerri Cooper, *Just Walk Across the Room* taught by Steve McLenegan and Karen Fong, *How to Study the Bible* taught by Pastor Jenny, *Prayer* taught by Joel Robinson and *Discovering Your SHAPE* taught by Pastor Rich and Rudy DuBord.

Library Ministry We witnessed a wonderful revival of the Library ministry this year due to the hard work and efforts of our Library Ministry team. Team members include: Peggy Shalloe, Jerri Cooper, Bev Walz and Marlene Goldman. The renewed ministry has opened up the Library for borrowing, and has installed a well-used book wheel in the Sanctuary.

Director of Student Ministries Search Due to the difficult financial situation, the search for a full-time Director of Student Ministries was put on hold. The search will resume in 2010.

Annual Report, Diaconate Chairman

I usually try to find one or more scriptures that I feel summarize a particular year. 2008 was a year that I felt was over shadowed by anxiety over the economy and many personal challenges for the members of the congregation. I feel that in 2009 God demonstrated His faithfulness towards SCFBC in many different ways.

A scripture that I believe speaks to this is Ephesians 3:20 – 21:

²⁰Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us, ²¹to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever! Amen.

The Capital Funds campaign was certainly a highlight early in 2009. This was long in planning, bathed in prayer and wonderfully executed. I really wasn't sure what to expect with a down economy and many people out of work. How much would be given for the initial gift? Individuals response to the question, "what would God have me do" led to initial gifts of over \$200,000. God certainly accomplished much more than I imagined.

The actual construction kicked off with the Renovation committee deciding to handle management of the project with existing church members. This approach saved a significant amount of money, and allowed for quick, low cost changes or upgrades to the finished project.

The middle part of 2009 seemed to be dominated with a concern about the fact that giving was below expectations with high expenses remaining. Our finance committee did an excellent job analyzing the situations and helping the church to manage expenses. Another sign of God exceeding our expectations is the fact that 2009 ended with almost a \$7000 surplus of income above expenses while earlier in the year we were anticipating an approximate \$20,000 - \$25,000 possible deficient.

Bethlehem was another blessing as we had extremely wet weather but over 11,000 visitors still attended.

2010 looks like it will have similar financial challenges. We need to construct a retaining wall behind the church and construct a facility to house the Bethlehem materials. While these look like "how will we ever find the money?" kind of challenges, the lesson of 2009 is that God will do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power working within us.

Annual Report, Finance

2009 will possibly be remembered as one of the most fiscally challenging times of our lives. It was a year, and for some continues to be, of economic uncertainty. So were the challenges for Santa Clara First Baptist Church. Throughout the year, our membership was reminded that the leadership of SCFBC was acting carefully to control the expenses relating to operating the church. Because of the blessings of God, the generosity of the membership and careful fiscal management, SCFBC ended the year with very few bumps and bruises.

The Statement of Income and Expense included in this report is divided into four categories: General Fund Income and Expense; Memorials Fund Income and Expense; Designated Fund Income and Expense; and Missions Fund Income and Expense.

General Fund: The General Fund is the money that is used to handle the day-to-day operations of the church. All expenses that are calculated into the annual budget come from the General Fund. General Fund income is derived from Envelope and Loose Giving, Cellular Antenna Income, Interest, Rent from the Korean Church and various miscellaneous sources. The total General Fund Income for 2009 was \$427,602. Despite the down economy, this was a modest increase in income of \$4,384 (+1.0%) above 2008 giving. General Fund spending was kept in check and total expenses for 2009 were \$420,815. This equates to a slight net income of \$6,787. This was a significant improvement compared to the prior year which experienced a net loss of -\$21,104.

Memorials Fund: These funds are given as memorials to SCFBC by members and/or families of members who have passed away. 2009 experienced \$5,328 in such gifts.

Designated Fund: Designated Funds is the money given to be used for specific ministries, programs or projects. Most notable for 2009 was the Renovation Building Fund. Because of the surge in giving for the Church Renovation, the Net Income for Designated Funds was \$112,516. As a caution, it must be recognized that next year (2010) the Designated Funds will most likely recognize a loss as the 2009 Renovation income will be expended throughout the year.

Missions Fund: Similar to Designated Funds, the Missions Fund is money that is given to be used specifically for missions. Total Missions Fund income for 2009 was \$45,408. Total Missions Funds distributed were \$43,241. The year-end Net Income for Missions was \$2,166. That amount will be distributed during 2010 as no Missions Funds are retained by SCFBC.

Looking Forward: It appears the challenges of 2009 will continue into this new year. The leadership of SCFBC will continue to be fiscally responsible throughout 2010. I have faith that God will continue to do His good works through SCFBC just as my faith in the generosity of all our membership remains strong.

Through Him all things are possible.

Annual Report, Missions

During 2009 the Mission Department continued to build on many of the programs and outreach opportunities started in previous years. We sent out four Mission Teams. Lisa Robinson and Joan Friesen went as delegates to Limón, Costa Rica for the new library dedication at a school run by our sister church, New Hope Baptist. We sent a team again to Ensenada, Mexico to conduct a VBS with a local church there. In addition, we had 2 teams go to Mexico to do construction on a school for orphans in Ensenada.

SCFBC continued its outreach to our local community serving as host to Emergency Housing Consortium's Cold Weather Shelter Program. We had about 120 homeless men and women that spent the night in our Fellowship Hall one weekend in February. Our guests were treated to hot meals, a warm place to sleep, Bible study, prayer, movies, games and fellowship.

Over the summer we had a new outreach activity called "Adopt A School". We collected school supplies for Scott Lane Elementary School (where a couple members of SCFBC work) as a way to help and to build a relationship with that school.

In late fall, members of the EDGE congregation coordinated an outreach activity of carrying dozens of bags of coats, socks and blankets to San Francisco to distribute to the homeless. In addition, the Prayers and Squares ministry is going well and has given 18 quilts to literally cover people in prayer.

Annual Report, American Baptist Women

AB Women's Ministries continues to hold regular meetings, sponsor special church events, and support missions at home and around the world.

The two circles, which are named for missionaries, meet monthly. The Luran Bethell Circle meets the second Tuesday and the Mylinda Baits/Leslie Turley Circle meets the second Wednesday for a time of fellowship, devotions, work projects and, of course, refreshments.

In addition there is a workday the first Wednesday of the month at 10:00 AM. At these meetings in 2009 we tore strips from old sheets, sewed the strips together, measured them and rolled 200 bandages for hospitals in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. We made and stuffed over 100 ditty bags for the Seafarers Ministry of the Golden Gate in Oakland and packed shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child.

In March we held our annual Scholarship Luncheon at the Art Institute of California in Sunnyvale. \$400 was raised for the scholarship program of AB Women's Ministries of the West which provides financial assistance for seminary students in this area as well as students at Bacone College in Oklahoma and Convention Baptist Bible College in the Philippines.

In May the Spring Tea was also held at the Art Institute of California. Proceeds from the fashion show went to the Love Gift offering.

September was the Fall kick-off and the packing of the ditty bags for the Seafarers. We delivered the ditty bags to Oakland in October where we also helped pack more bags with items that had been donated by other churches and individuals.

We were also involved with the two SCFBC rummage sales, from which we received a portion of the proceeds with the rest going to other church ministries such as Bethlehem. .

One of our biggest mission projects each year is White Cross. We sent a gift card for \$100 to the Christian Center in Sacramento so they could purchase needed items. We also gave \$430 to our overseas project, an organization that works with Baptist Women in the Republic of Georgia in Europe.

We participated in the SHARES program sponsored by Lucky and Save Mart stores. We get a check each quarter for a percentage of what people spend at these stores when they show their SHARES card. We have used the money to purchase sunscreen for the troops overseas, Love Gift, and to provide funds for the women's chaplain at Elmwood.

We have started sponsoring special outings several times a year and invite anyone who wants to come to join us for these fun events.

Women of all ages are encouraged to join us for any of our events.
