# ' Costa Rica 2008

Are you ready for the adventure?

Preparations are being made for our 8<sup>th</sup> team to head to Limon, Costa Rica, to partner with our sister church in their ministry at the Baptist School of the Caribbean. Is this your year?

A team from New Hope Baptist Church will come up from Costa Rica in July to help us with Vacation Bible School. Our team will travel with them as they return to Costa Rica around July 21<sup>st</sup>. We'll be gone for approximately nine days, including travel.

The cost of \$1300.00 includes air travel, all expenses while in Costa Rica, and an overnight excursion to Tortuguerro National Park. Applications and more information are available from group leader Joan Friesen via e-mail, joan@redwoodglen.com, or by phone at (650) 879-9469.



Upcoming regional events include Truth & Training Bible Quiz and the AwanaGames, both happening in March. We hope to take a T&T team (or perhaps 1.5 teams) to the AwanaGames. Our Game Time for the next 9 weeks will focus on the 10 games normally featured at the AwanaGames. Clubbers must have passed 10 handbook sections in order to attend. Also, three or four T&T clubbers are going to prepare to attend the Bible Quiz in Los Altos. Clubbers who attend the Bible Quiz must have a thorough knowledge of the first four Discoveries of Book I, plus the Start Zone. We are providing them with training and practice tools.

Through Bible quiz and AwanaGames, we hope to further our goal of attracting more people to Awana and our church. Relatives and friends of the participants will attend these events and hear the message of the gospel. They will see our group's involvement, and hopefully they will want to get involved, or tell someone else who might want to. Being involved will strengthen the bonds between us within our club, making it more of a "going concern." Kids will be more likely to return next year, and to tell other kids about the group. Please pray for our Awana clubbers and their leaders as they prepare in the coming months for the competitions that lay ahead.

Meanwhile of course we continue with our usual Awana calendar, including such favorites as Drive-In Movie Nite and the Awana Store. Every week clubbers earn points for wearing their uniforms, bringing their materials and Bibles, passing sections and bringing friends. We welcome more kids! As we enter into this New Year we anticipate the approval of our Renovation Plans by the City of Santa Clara. Today, January 22, I discussed where we are in the process with Alex Ross, our architect. He mentioned that the normal 6 week period of review should be just about over and we should hear from them soon.

Alex also mentioned there may be an issue or two that the city will insist we add to our plans. The two greatest possibilities are the installation of fire alarm stations at various locations within the Worship Center and the installation of a ramp to our front platform. We will just have to wait for the city's response.

After we finalize our plans we'll be able to send them out for bids from building contractors. This will finally give us a realistic estimation of the final cost of the Renovation.

I ask for your continued prayers as we move through this process. We are engaged in this Renovation to position our facilities to be more attractive and effective in reaching out to our community. As the apostle Paul became "*all things to all men so that he may by all means save some*" (1 Corinthians 9:22), we in kind need to create a sacred space that will provide a welcoming and effective atmosphere to the newer generations of seekers that are coming through our doors on a regular basis.
