In August 1976, Glenn Stowell, his wife, Rose, and their children Maureen, David, Paul and Mark



Rose and I attended different elementary **Glenn and Rose Stowell** schools and met at our junior high school. We started dating and graduated together in 1946. Rose then headed off to secretarial school in Boston and a year later I joined the U.S. Navy and became a radio and radar operator with the Navy Airdalets, but never served on a ship.

Rose and I went our separate ways and after three years in the Navy I moved to Longview, Texas and attended LeTourneau Technical Institute. The Institute was founded by R.G. LeTourneau, who invented many earthmoving machines.

On a trip back to Massachusetts Rose and I found each other again, and after my graduation, we married in 1955. We moved to Holbrook, Massachusetts and lived there for almost twenty years. We moved to California where I began working as a mechanical engineer at a new job. I began looking for a Baptist Church to attend and found SCFBC. Pastor Owen Miller was the senior Pastor at that time and Pastor Rich (who was still single) was his assistant Pastor, mentoring the youth.

It was at this church that we first met Mr. Aubie Harness and his wife, Jean. Rose and I joined the Philathians, a Sunday School Class that Mrs. Harness, Mrs. Lucille Gardner and Mrs. Betty Hickman had started. The Opportunity Class brought the truths of God's love to developmentally-challenged children and adults in a Sunday School class setting. These families all had children who would benefit; the children were joined by many other classmates over the years. It wasn't long before Jean invited me to become a member of her staff, where I remained for over twenty years. The church staff and family were very supportive and furnished teachers, song leaders and pianists.

Shortly after I joined the church, Pastor Miller asked me to become the church's representative to the Boy Scout Troop the church had sponsored since the early 1970's. The rewards of this community effort is evidenced by a plaque hanging in the Narthex with over eighty Eagle Scouts names engraved, including two of Pastor Rich's and Suzi's sons.

I thank God for his many blessings and as we remember the first anniversary of Rose's passing, my family and I, along with her many friends, are comforted by God's promise of an eternal life in Heaven.
