The women's restroom is finished and came out looking fantastic. Our blue and white restroom with broken sinks has been transformed into a beautiful warm restroom. We have a new baby changing table, handicap accessible stall, wood grain partitions, energy efficient lighting, tile floor and walls, large granite counter, a supply drawer with baby wipes and feminine products, new carpet, new furniture, motion activated lighting, speakers to hear the service, emergency lighting, and insulated walls.

Many volunteer man hours went into the restroom project to help our construction foreman, Adam Burdick. Ken Harrell (cleanup), Duane Esquibel (plumbing), Lloyd Darknell (electrical/plumbing), Tom Caldwell (painting), Tim McLenegan (electrical), Jenny Gregg (sewing/decorating), Steve McLenegan (cleaning), Joe Lasher (tile), Matt Juarez (tile), Sharon Cintas (design/ decorating), and Jerry Cintas (management/design/ electrical) are part of the that made it happen. With the completion of the women's restroom we have moved into the Men's Restroom and have already started jack hammering the floor to adjust the stalls for accessibility requirements. The men's restroom will have similar tile, partitions, and granite counter tops when completed.

Bill & Geneva Ash

Bill Ash was born in El Paso, Texas in 1922. When his parents married, they each had children from their previous marriages so they started their union with eight children. Bill was the firstborn from their second marriage and he was followed by seven more children. Bill says their family of 18(!) ate together at a long table with benches along the sides.

When he was six years old, Bill's family left Texas during the height of the Great Depression and finally resettled in Bakersfield. Eventually they moved to Santa Rosa when Bill was in high school. During his time there he worked at a local pharmacy, but upon graduation from Santa Rosa High School he

moved to San Francisco to study furniture finishing and cabinet making at Samuel Gompers Trade School. Soon after the attack on Pearl Harbor, he left his apprenticeship in San Francisco to join the Navy. His previous experience in the pharmacy in Santa Rosa led him to train in San Diego as a Navy Medical Corpsman.

Although his family was very large they stayed close through the years. Once while in dock in Nu Mea, New Caladonia during the Christmas holidays, Bill noticed another ship in the same port. Recognizing that as the ship on which one of his brothers was serving as chief electrician, he made arrangements (even threatening to go AWOL of necessary) to share Christmas dinner with his brother whom he had not seen in a long time.

Geneva Ash was born in 1924 in Oklahoma and moved to Tucson, Arizona at the age of seven. Her parents also had children from previous marriages so Geneva grew up with five half-siblings. Upon graduation from high school, with a heart to serve God and the needy, Geneva moved to San Francisco to attend school for training to work for the Lord in the church of the Salvation Army. That was a big move for a single young woman at that time, one that required great faith. Once she completed her training in San Francisco, she moved to Santa Rosa.

Bill finished his service in the Navy, returned to Santa Rosa and started attending the Salvation Army Church there with his mother. There he met Geneva.

When Geneva left Santa Rosa to return to Tucson, Bill was not far behind. They married in 1944 and moved to Stockton. Evidently, they decided that a large family was not necessary and had only two daughters, Barbara and Carol. They are also proud to have one granddaughter and three grandsons and four greatgrandsons.

While living in Stockton, Geneva's heart to help the needy was once again stirred and she went to Stockton Junior College for her LVN degree. She worked at St. Joseph's Hospital in Stockton and at both Stanford Hospital and the Veterans' Hospital in Palo Alto once they relocated to the Bay Area.

Desiring to make SCFBC their church home, both Bill and Geneva were baptized at SCFBC by Pastor Rich in 1980. During the past almost three decades, Bill and Geneva have faithfully served in various ministries here. Bill was head usher for about 20 years greeting Sunday morning worshipers each Sunday, resigning only because his hearing was deteriorating. He has used his furniture experience to help build the current AV booth and the sign for the Slocum Garden near the west parking lot. Geneva has served for years on the Prayer Chain, in ABW Ministries and fixing meals for others as needed.

Bill and Geneva may have had to "slow down" in their ministries at SCFBC, but they continue to be faithful in worship each Sunday morning. They both are grateful for the hearing devices provided so they don't miss out on any spoken word. Their years of faithful service as Disciples of Christ are a great example for us all.
