## Renovation Funding Update!

As we close out 2010 we can celebrate the faithful and generous giving of our people towards the church's renovation project. Barbara McLenegan, our Financial Secretary, recently provided the following information:

The current pledge balance is \$47,973.00. This is the remaining money pledged to the campaign which is yet to be given.

As of the end of October we have received \$29,410 in gifts given by those who made no pledge at all. In addition we've received an additional \$10,024 from people who had completed their pledge but have continued to give over and above that amount.

These are tough financial times. And yet, because God has inspired many to give to this project, we will be able to continue to upgrade our facilities so as to more effectively present the good news of the Gospel to those who come through our doors.

## Renovation Update!



The new hanging lights for the sanctuary are finally installed. There was lots of ceiling work to do to handle the large lights and electrical. They look great and we hope to have the ceiling patched up and painted before you read this.

The dimmers for these lights are still on order and will be installed next along with the keypads at the sanctuary entrances for controlling all the lights in the sanctuary.

We are hoping to have the new ceiling speakers installed by Christmas and are working on the conduits and brackets to support those speakers. The new speakers should give a more clear and pleasing sound for the congregation compared to the side speakers we have now that bounce the sound all over the room.

Duane Esquibel and John Pusateri got the wheel chair lift door installed and we are waiting for the new lift to come in next month so we can finish up that project. Adam is still recovering from a twisted knee and should be back on the job in January. Keep him in your prayers for a quick and full recovery.

Next we plan on working up on the stage near the choir loft to erect the new wall that will house one of the two new projection screens.

## **Mission to Schools and Students**

We have a wonderful opportunity to be a blessing to a local school – helping children in our community with the added joy of assisting one from our own church family . Kimberly Barnett is a 2<sup>nd</sup> grade teacher at Scott Lane Elementary School, located on Scott Blvd. near Warburton. For many of the students at Scott Lane, English is their second language. This makes learning to read very difficult, especially if their families are not able to help them.

Because reading is vitally important to a child's academic success, Kimberly has started an after-school reading program for the students in her class. The children involved in this program stay for an hour after school, Monday - Thursday. The children work at different learning centers in the classroom, playing games that teach and reinforce principles necessary for reading. Volunteers are needed to oversee the different centers, working with 4-5 children at a time, assisting them in playing the games that will ultimately help the children learn to read.

Here are the times the Kimberly needs volunteers:

- Mondays – 2:30-3:30
- Tuesdays – 2:30-3:30
- Wednesdays – 1:30-2:30
- Thursdays – 2:30-3:30

Kimberly is looking for volunteers who can possibly serve once a week. She needs 3-5 volunteers for each day. The more volunteers she has, the more children can be helped. High School youth are also invited to serve, which means we would then need volunteers to drive the youth from Santa Clara High School and Wilcox High School to Scott Lane.

This is a great opportunity to help a teacher go the extra mile in serving the children of her classroom. ### **BOOK REVIEWS**

- The Love Dare (section 5) is a companion book with the movie *FireProof*. Unconditional love is eagerly promised at weddings, but rarely practiced in real life. As a result, romantic hopes are often replaced with disappointment in the home. This is a 40-day challenge for husbands and wives to understand and practice unconditional love - a journey every married person needs to take. *“Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things, love never fails.”* (I Corinthians 13:7-8)
- Be Intolerant by Ryan Dobson and Jefferson Scott. (section 13). Yes, it does say ‘intolerant’. The authors reminds us that accepting everything means you believe in nothing. Sitting on the fence between right and wrong doesn’t get us anywhere - it is passivity, not love. Being intolerant to wrong - to sin - is telling people the truth in love. This book shows us how to back up our Christian beliefs and be intolerant to worldly ways.
