How God leads or how a Life Group was developed...

In October, Peggy Shalloe and I were at the Resource Area For Teachers (RAFT) using their die cut machines to cut out decorations for Trunk or Treat. I remember we were working quickly because the place was about to close when a woman came around and gave us a business card. She explained it was her daughters card, that she was there to get supplies for a class the daughter was going to teach on making cards. Making cards is one of my hobbies so it piqued my curiosity. Her daughter is the Executive Director of two non-profits organizations; one is called Kards4Soldiers and the other is called Kards4Kids. They were asking others to come along side and help make cards because the need was so great. As I said, we were short on time so I just got the card, and we went on cutting. But Peggy and I chatted about how maybe we might be able to get a group of people together to make some cards for Kards4Soldiers and help out..

Enter Life Groups 2.0 - a request went out about proposed classes for the first trimester ,so I talked with Pastor Rich with my proposed idea and the Cut~N~Paste Life Group was developed.

In December I sent the Executive Director an email to ask her "How can the SCFBC Cut-N-Paste Life Group help Kards4Soldiers"? Her extremely gracious reply not only included the answer but included an sincere invitation to attend a Appreciation Dinner Celebration for the 2011 helpers on January 12th. Gladys McFarland went with me. Imagine our surprise when we got to the dinner and discovered that the Executive Director is the ripe old age of 18!

Her projects got started three years ago when she discovered that her grandmother did not receive Valentines cards when she was in the hospital on Valentine's Day and that no one else in the hospital received cards either. So she decided she would make cards and contacted local hospitals to find out how many they thought they would need. When those cards were completed, she still "had time" and decided that the deployed military personnel could use cards too so she made some more. So the first year her organization sent out over 9,000 cards overseas, the second year the organization sent out over 11,000. Then in 2011 she got help from classrooms, churches, friends and they sent out 22,000 cards to military personnel overseas. I haven't even addressed her local distribution of cards to hospitals - nursing homes - doctors - nurses - police officers - sheriffs - CHP - fire fighters and EMT's ,so the total scope of the ministry is far reaching both locally and overseas.

I learned that there was a mailing date of January 26th for Valentines for overseas so on January 19th I gathered some of the members of the Cut-N-Paste Life Group so we could make Valentine cards. We wanted to contribute since we are partnering with "Kards4Soldiers" and knew that they were doing a mailing overseas. Seven of us met, made some cards and on Saturday, January 21st, I delivered 150 cards to the Executive Director Ruth Cormier. It is a blessing to partner with this group as Cut-N-Paste Life Group's outreach. **Thank you**, thank you to everyone who has donated new and old cards, calendars, pictures and "stuff" to our class! Our need now is card stock. paper We will use it as we learn more about card making, supplying cards for shut-ins, our own personal use and for partnering with "kards4soldiers". Thank you for your support!



A Word On Worship

One of my favorite passages in the Bible is John 12:3.

Then Mary took about a pint of pure nard, an expensive perfume; she poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped his feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume.

Mary comes to Jesus during a dinner in His honor with expensive perfume, pours it on Jesus' feet then she wipes it off with her hair. She comes to Him full of worship and gratitude. Her worship cost her something and it seems spontaneous. The next part is my favorite! It says at the end of verse 3 *"and the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume."* I like to think that wherever she went that day people could smell her worship and gratitude because it was in her hair. She smelled good everywhere she went. When we worship God here, we still smell good even after we leave!

I grew up with a strong sense of duty to God and to the church. I don't mean duty in a bad sense at all. God is worthy of our worship, service, our time, etc... I really believe that God should be worshipped simply because He is worthy. That is actually what the word 'worship' means, ascribing worth to God. There is honor in this type of worship; it is our "duty" because He is worth it! The danger in this, of course, is that it can become meaningless like it did with the Israelites. They had "worship of God because He is worthy" down pat, but it became a ritual - a formula - without meaning. Formulas don't work. Donald Miller in his book Blue Like Jazz says,

"I believe that the greatest trick of the devil is not to get us into some sort of evil, but rather have us wasting time. This is why the devil tries so hard to get Christians to be religious. If he can sink a person's mind into habit, he will prevent His heart from engaging God."

Worship out of duty or because we think we should or it's just something that we do every Sunday is honorable if you mean it, but even then I'm not so sure that you can smell it! Worship out of a deep gratitude and response to God's amazing love and grace is fragrant. 2 Corinthians 2:14-15 says,

In Christ, God leads us from place to place in one perpetual victory parade. Through us, He brings knowledge of Christ. Everywhere we go, people breathe in the exquisite fragrance. Because of Christ, we give off a sweet scent rising to God, which is recognized by those on the way of salvation – an aroma filled with life. (The Message)

Let's be a sweet aroma rising up to God and smelling good to others wherever we go.

Jesus did such a helpful thing for us when he distilled the Law and all his commandments down to this:

³⁷ Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'" Matthew 22:37 - 39

Then Jesus gave us our clear marching orders in what is known as the Great Commission:

¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

“This is a Football”

Pastor Rich referred to a story of Coach Vince Lombardi getting his wayward, ineffective football team back on track. Lombardi explained to the team that they needed to get back to the core of the game and, holding up a ball, he told them, “This is a football.”

For individual believers and for the church as a whole, the Great Commission is “the football”—our basic, defining standard. As we start to explore what it means make disciples, it is obvious that I must first determine whether I am a growing disciple myself. This requires careful examination of the heart—a process that can be difficult and even painful sometimes, but that is absolutely essential if we want to be an effective, growing church that makes disciples.

When I am more focused on how the chairs are arranged on a Sunday morning, or whether Sharon plays my favorite songs, or if I enjoy Pastor Rich's sermon, then I think I have crossed the line—I have become a **customer**, not a **disciple**.

I don't think God particularly cares whether I enjoy a worship service or not! I don't think he's even that interested in whether I “get something” out of the service. I strongly suspect that God is a lot more interested in what I put into the worship service. He cares about the condition of my heart.

Everything we do should be measured against the Great Commandment, and the Great Commission. Am I being a loving disciple of Jesus, or am I being a typical American consumer?



In so many parts of the world, believers meet together (often in secret and at great risk) with “nothing”—no pews, no church facilities, no musical instruments, no sanctuary or pulpit, and often even with no printed Bible! I suspect that in some ways they have an advantage over us at applying the gospel and growing as disciples.

Pastor Rich suggested that we need to “prune” our lives and hearts in order to flourish. I challenge each of us at Santa Clara First Baptist Church to acknowledge our consumer mentality toward church as the sin that it is. If we truly want our church to grow and be effective in making disciples, we need an emergency heart check-up now!

Life Groups 2.0!

Now is a fantastic time to try out a Life Group! The Winter/Spring trimester commences the week of February 5th with all Life Groups beginning a new 12-week session at that time. With a variety of Life Groups to choose from, there's sure to be one that is perfect for you.

Please remember - it is still necessary to sign up for a Life Group even if you plan to join a group you have already attended. Sign-ups end February 4th and spaces fill up, so don't delay!

What is a Life Group?

Life Groups are small groups that meet in homes and other locations. They give people in the church a chance to get to know each other better, make friends, support each other and grow in their faith. We offer a range of Life Groups for all ages and with all sorts of interests.

Why trimesters?

As we discussed in the November *Celebrate!*, all Life Groups will operate on a trimester calendar. They will start the same week, meet for about twelve weeks, and break for a month in order to form new groups, recruit new leaders, and allow time for sign-ups for the next trimester. Having a common starting point gives everyone a chance to join in a group at the beginning. Having an end date means you can join a group without "signing your life away" either as a participant or a leader. The Life Groups stay fresh and growing!

Will I have to pray in front of other people?

No one is singled out to do anything in front of the group. All participation is determined by the individual, moving forward at his/her comfort level.

So how do I sign up?

Signing up for a Life Group is simple! All you do is look through the brochure and pick the group you want to join. Then you write the group number on the back of your registration card and drop it in the offering plate or turn it into the friendly person at the Information Table in the Lobby. You can also sign up online at <http://www.scfbc.org>.

Why are we changing the existing Life Groups?

Many people in our church have been in Life Groups and have thoroughly enjoyed it. But many hesitate to join a group that has been meeting together for years or they are nervous about getting tied to one group indefinitely. Having trimesters also allows people to lead groups when their schedules permit and still be able to take off a trimester if they need to.

But I like the Life Group I'm already in. Can I still be in the same Life Group?

Of course you are welcome to sign up for any group you want, and if you want to continue with the same leader (if the leader chooses to lead the same group), you can sign up for that group. Some groups may take an additional trimester to finish a study. **But remember, it is still necessary to sign up for your Life Group even if you have already been part of it.**

If we want to grow and mature in our faith, we need the encouragement of other believers. The truth is you can't really grow spiritually in isolation. By joining a Life Group, you will make friends, be challenged in your faith, and have a lot of fun at the same time. Sign up today!
