Time for Spiritual Spring Cleaning?



Right after the holidays is one of my favorite times for cleaning out the junk in my closets and garage. For many people, the New Year also presents a perfect opportunity for cleaning out personal bad habits and making resolutions for better living. Some of the most common resolutions include losing weight—fixing finances—exercising and eating right—quitting smoking—spending more time with family—getting organized...

Christians like to make spiritual resolutions too—read the Bible more—pray more—go to church—volunteer...Usually, though, almost all of these admittedly noble resolutions are doomed to fail. Failure is even more likely when we imagine that something miraculous happens between December 31 and January 1.

To make real, lasting change, perhaps the most important question (especially for followers of Christ) is WHY do we want to make these changes? In the book, *Sacred Rhythms*, Ruth Haley Barton puts it this way:

Christian tradition has a name for the structure that enables us to say yes to the process of spiritual transformation day in and day out. It is called *a rule of life*. A rule of life seeks to respond to two questions: Who do I want to be? How do I want to live? Actually, it might be more accurate to say that a rule of life seeks to address the interplay between these two questions: *How do I want to live so I can be who I want to be*?

Create a rule of life

St. Benedict was the first to create and define a "rule of life"—or intentional way of living in order to facilitate spiritual growth and relationship with God. Benedict's rule of life for his community of monks centered on three elements—prayer, study and work.

Barton points out that exploring and practicing a variety of spiritual disciplines takes time and determination. Discovering how various disciplines impact and fit into our lives will not happen overnight (and certainly not in one holiday season). However, learning to live here and now in the kingdom of God is the whole reason Jesus came.

How does this impact our church?

When Jesus began his ministry, and there was SO much work to do, and so many people who needed him, Mark records how Jesus made his relationship with the Father his top priority (Mark 1:35-39), making time spent with the Father the foundation for his day and his ministry. It is really easy to get excited about the wonderful things that God is doing at SCFBC. However, we have to remember that God wants us individually first—not the work we do for him. So when it comes to cleaning out our cluttered schedules, making time and space for God alone must come first—everything else will flow from that. "Steep your life in Godreality, Godinitiative, Godprovisions. Don't worry about missing out. You'll find all your everyday human concerns will be met."

How do I want to live so I can be who I want to be?—Maybe our only resolution for 2013 should be to address this question prayerfully and thoughtfully. May God bless you with a deeper sense of his present kingdom this year!

Membership classes called "Back to Basics" will be held two or three times during 2013 - dates and times to be determined. Topics covered let you know more about making a commitment to the church.

Food Pantry: Non-perishable food items are accepted from contributors and redistribute it to those in need. It is available in two-bag distribution to people who ask for a food donation at the office. The bags are prepared and there are six sets available at all times. Please let people know that food bags can be picked up the last week of the month - for people who attend church or for your friends in need also. About 150 food bags are given away annually and from 4-6 families were helped last Thanksgiving and Christmas with holiday dinner "starter kits".

Fellowship Fund: You can either donate to this fund by indicating "Fellowship Fund" on your giving envelope or if needed - ask for funds from it. This fund helps people in their hour of need for emergency or unexpected bills or expenses.— please make your request through either Pastor Rich or Pastor Jenny. Thanks to your generous giving, this year ten families were helped with \$7,323 from the fund.

Good Samaritans: Maxine Darknell coordinates a group of people who help others with little chores that you may not be able to handle for a variety of reasons. Could be food preparation, giving rides for medical appointments, yard work - things like that. Call Maxine if you want help or if you want to be available to help people with chores like this. Sometimes we just can't do it all alone.

Visitation: What a blessing it is when Life Group members or individuals visit or help others recovering from illnesses. We are here to extend a hand of comfort and prayer to each other.

Thank you - I've learned a lot over the years serving as a Membership Deacon. Thank you for the experience. I just had a meeting with Denise Stephens, the new 2013 SCFBC Membership Deacon. She is looking forward to serving the church in this capacity.
