# **Moving Forward**

We continue to move forward as a church, to fulfill the prescriptions given to us by Dr. Hoyt. An Envisioning Team has been formed, which will meet with Dr. Hoyt for 2 weekends in March to determine our core values as a church and to work on our vision statement and a mission.

The deacons are working on establishing our Guiding Principles, i.e. our Ministry Principles, Boundary Principles and Accountability Principles. We had an extended board meeting on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, and will also be doing the same on March 2<sup>nd</sup> to discuss these important issues. We will then work with Dr. Hoyt on setting the final principles which will be presented to the SCFBC family.

Also a small group is working on rewriting our church constitution to fit the way the church is to be governed.

This will be presented to the church for discussion and passage later in the year, probably in the fall.

Please be in prayer regarding what you can do as we work together to fulfill these prescriptions. Also pray for the various committees working on these tasks: the deacons, the envisioning team and the constitution team. If you have any questions about what is happening, feel free to ask me or Pastor Richard.

As Barbara has written above, our leadership team (staff and deacons) has been working hard on the challenge of improving the nuts and bolts of our church's governance and organizing documents. Our church family as a whole has been given the greater challenge of bringing the focus of our church's work and energies more into line with God's will.

The Prescription #1 from Dr. Bill Hoyt gives us a **goal-based vision** for our future in 2013. To achieve this vision will require a greater commitment than we have previously made to the work of God's Kingdom. Consider how you can contribute to the fulfill each of these prescriptions:

Increased evangelistic outreach (15 baptisms) and (45 involved in influencing for decisions)

*Who do you know that needs to know Jesus personally?*

Increased commitment to sharing/learning together (90 in Life Groups)

*How are you involved in our small group ministry?*

Increased involvement in ministry/mission (65%)

*How are you serving Christ both in and outside our church?*

Increased level of financial giving (20% increase in giving)

*How can you realign your financial priorities to be able to give more to Christ's work?*

If we are to see God "perform amazing things among us" we need to consecrate ourselves to Him and His purposes for us. Only then will we be ready to receive and respond to God's instructions and His empowerment to carry them out.

# No Spiritual Gift Receipts!

Have you ever given someone a really special gift that you were excited for them to open? Something that you knew was perfect for them and that they could really use? So how would you feel if that person thanked you sincerely, then put your gift away without ever taking it out of the box?

When we give our lives to Jesus, we become part of God's family. The Bible makes it clear that the Holy Spirit gives every believer spiritual gifts—no exceptions (1 Corinthians 12:7). Spiritual gifts come in different shapes and sizes, but the purpose of all the gifts is for the common good of the Church, the Body of Christ. This means that God has given you a unique gift designed especially for you. The big question is: How are you using it? Are you using it at all?

## **But what's in the box?**

Many Christians have no idea how the Holy Spirit has gifted them. While there are quizzes and inventories available to help you identify your gift (or gifts), your experiences and the feedback of others can often be a prime indicator of your spiritual gifts. So if you have never tried certain things, you may have no clear idea of whether you are gifted in that area. If you've never shared your faith, how do you know if you might have the gift of evangelism? If you've never opened your home to others, how do you know whether or not you have the gift of hospitality?

For years, I held the position that I am not gifted to lead a Bible study. It was only a couple of years ago that it finally dawned on me that I had never actually led a small group, so how did I really know? I admitted to myself (and God), that I was actually just scared and uncomfortable at the thought of assuming such a role.

## **Get your feet wet**

In his book, *If You Want to Walk on Water You Have to Get Out of the Boat*, John Ortberg describes the habit that God has of asking us to take the first step before He uses us for His purposes. Ortberg suggests that God helps a person's faith to grow by requiring them to make the first move. In doing so, we trust Him to guide and sustain us come what may. Ortberg writes, "When I risk using my spiritual gift, I can know the joy of being used by God—but I have to get my feet wet first." The act of obediently offering ourselves for God's use, however He sees fit, makes God smile and gives Him the chance to show us His power and faithfulness.

## **Time to grow up!**

There's a saying that a person's spiritual journey is like rowing upstream—if you aren't actively rowing, you are drifting back downstream. There's no such thing as standing still when it comes to spiritual growth. When we listen to God and step out of our comfort zone, we will grow. As for me, I still don't know whether or not I actually have the gift of teaching or leadership. But I do know that agreeing to try it caused a huge spiritual growth spurt for me.

Taking that first step of faith and obedience definitely leads to spiritual growth but frankly, too many people leave their precious gift from God to gather dust—unopened and unused.

# Missions

The annual report, which resides on the church's website, now has an updated Missions page containing more of my input. A special thanks to those who gave or assisted with outreach efforts which weren't reflected on the original hardcopy annual report. We're continuing to search for ways to help with the Silicon Valley BBQ Championship (28-29 June in Central Park) and the Santa Clara Art & Wine Festival (14-15 September).

- For the BBQ competition, we've reached out to the Rotary Club/Kansas City Barbeque Society (organizer) and to the city offering whatever volunteer help they need.
- At the Santa Clara Art & Wine Fest, we intend to have a booth. The concept for the booth involves Legos. **If you have any “standard” Lego bricks you are willing to donate to this cause, please do so.** We'll have a large, low table with SCFBC already built on it. We'll issue small boxes of Legos in exchange for contact info and the visitors can build structures and place them in Lego Santa Clara. **Book Nook** - The books displayed this month coordinate with the continuing sermon series of “Rooted In Love” about Christ dwelling in us. There will also be books about Easter which is March 31st this year.

## **DVD Reviews:**

**Daniel’s Lot** (2009): Ignore the rudimentary style of this movie and see how **it takes many people** to help someone come to the Lord. The movie set-up is maybe longer than it needs to be and it is heartbreaking but you’ll get the point and the rest of the movie is edifying. Also watch the interview in the “Special Features” section - it is helpful and can help SCFBC see how God works through us when we are obedient to God’s plan for our lives.

**Amazing Love - the Story of Hosea** (2012): This is an interesting mix of modern day scenes and Old Testament day scenes depicting the story of the prophet Hosea. It is a powerful **story of redemption** presented by a church youth leader on a weekend camping trip.

**The Perfect Gift** (2009): This movie was made by the same producer at *The Perfect Stranger*. What if the world threw you a birthday party and you weren’t invited? Put together a spoiled teenage, an overworked executive mother and a disillusioned young minister, throw in three uplifting messages about faith, tradition and the true meaning of Christmas and you have *The Perfect Gift* story - a year-around message for all ages.

**Journey to Grace, The Hansie Cronje Story** (2008): How do you start over once you’ve betrayed a nation’s trust? This is a true story—a classical prodigal son story, a journey through South Africa, India and England with the South African Cricket Team. It is an inspiring human drama that people from all walks of life can relate to. As always the Special Features section adds to the story.

**Redemption Ride** (2011): This is a moving story of forgiveness, love and second chances as a man learns to trust his heavenly Father again. It also shows the awesome ministry that can be accomplished from a hospital bed.

We were placed in a Displaced Persons Camp in West Germany for 5 years. In 1949, we came to the "Shore of Liberty," New York and then to Maryland as my father was "bonded" to work for one year on a farm there.

Through correspondence we found the pastor from the Camp who had resettled in New Jersey. In 1951 we migrated there and joined the small Ukrainian Baptist congregation. I was happy, surrounded by familiar people who loved me and loved the Lord. At age 12 I accepted my loving Lord and His forgiving grace into my young heart. At age 15 I was baptized.

After living in Ohio and Toronto, Canada, my husband and children and I came to California in 1966. Since then, I have been able to serve in church in many roles, including a board member of the Good Samaritan Mission, supporting national missionaries in Ukraine.



Now God has led me to SCFBC where I have found a people who love the Lord and serve Him wholeheartedly. At this point in my life, God has spoken to me through Psalm 25:10: "And when we obey Him every path he guides us on is fragrant with His loving-kindness and His truth."


