Moving Forward

A few weekends ago a group of seven people from SCFBC met with Dr. Bill Hoyt to create a new set of belief statements based on what God's word, the Bible, tells us. This group, called an Envisioning Team, logged about 30 hours from a Friday morning to a Sunday afternoon. Through a lot of concentrated work <u>and</u> a lot of reliance on the Holy Spirit it was able to complete its work in one weekend rather than the two that had been scheduled for the process.

Below are the "We Believe" statements that emerged from its deliberations. Each one highlights a basic understanding of the nature and work of God in our lives and our response to Him. Along with each belief is an action statement. Because we believe, we will act on the basis of those beliefs.

Read each over a few times and reflect on its meaning for our church and our personal lives.

We believe in the one creative and loving God revealed to the world as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.	Therefore we will demonstrate God's love to all people.
We believe God the Father rules with perfect mercy, compassion and wisdom.	Therefore we will trust God and submit to His authority.
We believe God the Son, Jesus, became human, providing the only way to reconcile imperfect people with the perfect God.	Therefore we will share Jesus, who is the only way to reconciliation with God.
We believe God the Holy Spirit teaches and empowers followers of Jesus to know and obey God.	Therefore we will rely on the Holy Spirit to empower us to obey God.
We believe the Bible is God's unchanging truth, essential for teaching, correcting and training for living out God's plan.	Therefore the Bible will be the basis of our public teaching, individual study and personal living.
We believe the Church, a diverse community formed and led by Jesus, works together to continue His work in the world.	Therefore we will work together, each doing our part to continue Jesus' work.
We believe God is worthy of and delighted by a life lived in worship, honoring Him in everything we do.	Therefore we will honor God in everything we think, say and do.
We believe prayer deepens our relationship with God, aligns us with His will, and leads to God releasing His power.	Therefore we will live a life of prayer, trusting God's wisdom and power.
