#### Check out one of the following great DVD's in the Book Nook for a movie night:


*The Radicals* - Early history about breaking away from baby baptisms, and the beginning of the Anabaptists

# Moving Forward

Another one of the prescriptions the deacons are working on is writing a new set of Bylaws, which will replace the constitution we now have. The committee now has a draft which will be presented to the deacons for their input. Several meetings will be held later in the year at which time anyone who is interested can discuss the document and make suggestions. Copies will be distributed in advance. # Finance Department


Things are looking fiscally positive for SCFBC. As of April 30<sup>th</sup>, compared to last year, giving is up more than 16%! We are extremely blessed that our members have given so generously and consistently. Increased giving may be due either to the challenge made earlier this year by Pastor Rich to increase giving by 20% or because weekly attendance has been on the rise; most likely a combination of both.

Recognizing this increase is important, but it is equally important to not become complacent in our giving habits. Never consider your tithes and offerings to be insignificant. It is the collective sum of our giving that affects and maintains the finances of SCFBC.

I must apologize to those who attended the quarterly meeting, because at that time I incorrectly reported that the year-to-date net income was nearly \$24,000.00. I broke a basic rule in accounting: "Never report without review". Unfortunately, this number was based upon the financial reports that had not yet been reviewed by the Finance Committee. Upon review, it was determined that the actual year-to-date net income is approximately \$3,900.00. (An error was made in the original financial statements which failed to include total payroll expenses for the month of April.)

This does not mean that \$20,000.00 disappeared from our accounts. Instead, it means that a complete comparison of income to expenses was not calculated. Rest assured, being in a positive income condition, by any amount, at this time of year should be looked upon as moving in the right financial direction. The Finance Committee will continue its responsibility to monitor the finances of SCFBC.
