Life Groups 2.0!

It’s time! January is the month to sign up for new Life Groups, and the Life Groups 2.0 brochure is now available in print or on the SCFBC website. By using this brochure, you can find a Life Group that best matches your needs and schedule. All through January we will take sign-ups for Life Groups. **Remember—you need to sign up for a Life Group even if you plan to join a group you have already attended. Sign-ups end February 4th and spaces fill up, so don’t delay!**

What is a Life Group?

Life Groups are the small groups that meet in homes and other locations. They give people in the church a chance to get to know each other better, make friends, support each other and grow in our faith. We offer a range of Life Groups for all ages and with all sorts of interests.

Why trimesters?

As we discussed in the November *Celebrate!*, all Life Groups will operate on a trimester calendar. They will start the same week, meet for about twelve weeks, and break for a month in order to form new groups, recruit new leaders, and allow time for sign-ups for the next trimester. Having a common starting point gives everyone a chance to join in a group at the beginning. Having an end date means you can join a group without “signing your life away” either as a participant or a leader. The Life Groups stay fresh and growing!

Will I have to pray in front of other people?

No one is singled out to do anything in front of the group. All participation is determined by the individual, moving forward at his/her comfort level.

So how do I sign up?

Signing up for a Life Group is simple! All you do is look through the brochure and pick the group you want to join. Then you write the group number on the back of your registration card and drop it in the offering plate or at the Information Table in the Lobby. You can also sign up online at <http://www.scfbc.org>.

Why are we changing the existing Life Groups?

Many people in our church have been in Life Groups and have thoroughly enjoyed it. But many hesitate to join a group that has been meeting together for years or they are nervous about getting tied to one group indefinitely. Having trimesters also allows people to lead groups when their schedules permit and still be able to take off a trimester if they need to.

But I like the Life Group I’m already in. Can I still be in the same Life Group?

Of course you are welcome to sign up for any group you want, and if you want to continue with the same leader (if the leader chooses to lead the same group), you can sign up for that group. Some groups may take an additional trimester to finish a study. **But remember, you must sign up for your Life Group even if you have already been part of it.**

If we want to grow and mature in our faith, we need the encouragement of other believers. The truth is you can’t really grow spiritually in isolation. By joining a Life Group, you will make friends, be challenged in your faith, and have a lot of fun at the same time. Sign up today!

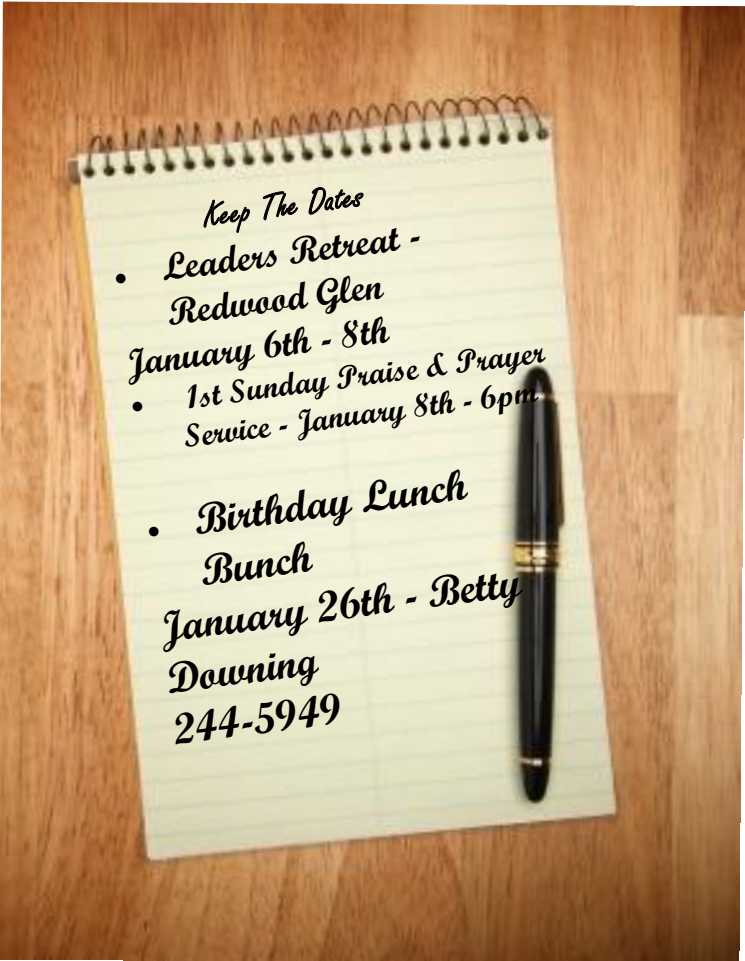

Maturity Report

A Resolution with Eternal Rewards!

There’s an old saying that just being in a garage doesn’t make you are a car. I’ve heard that related to exercise—just because you step into a gym doesn’t mean that you are physically fit. And of course, this could also apply to Christians—just because you go to church, doesn’t mean that you are a disciple of Jesus.

We’ve been talking about restoring this church—getting back to basics, repentance, and the gospel. But many of us don’t make the connection between “the church” (or “SCFBC”) and “me”. Amos prophesied against the people of Judah in the Old Testament. They thought that they were secure and safe because they enjoyed the status of being God’s people—even though they as individuals worshipped idols, oppressed the poor, and turned a blind eye to the social injustices around them. They smugly believed that because they enjoyed peace and prosperity as a nation, they had Yahweh’s blessing and seal of approval. It is so easy for us to slip into that mentality ourselves. We may agree that the focus of our church needs to be renewed, but unless individuals change in conjunction with a restoration at SCFBC, then restoring the church is a waste of time.

My choir teacher used to nag us to learn our parts, to practice, and to come to rehearsal ready to sing. He would say, “A chain is only as strong as the weakest link”—meaning that we would never be an excellent choir unless every individual carried their weight. Who cares that everyone else sounded fabulous, if Jenny was in the alto section hitting clinkers?

God said to those comfortable, complacent residents of Judah:

Renovation Update!

We didn't write an article in November, but are super excited to see the Sanctuary very close to completion with the new carpet installed and the stage completed. What a big difference carpet makes. The room used to feel cold and dirty and now feels warm and alive. Thanks again to **Steve Erling** for providing his installers and discounts on the carpet. **Tom Caldwell** has also been in the Sanctuary, touching up paint and finishing up paint projects. It is looking great!



Mike Depew poured the new ramp into the sanctuary and it so much nicer not having the thresholds to walk over.
Ken Rangel has finished up the tile in the west entry and it looks great.

In December we started our final inspections with the City of Santa Clara. The Fire Inspection went fairly smoothly with no big problems except for some questions on the Lobby exit plan. Fire handed over the decisions on that to the building department, but we don't foresee any big hurdles. The building inspections came through and the City wants us to complete some firewalls in the pastors' offices before they finalize the project. It is our hope that we can get those firewalls and doors completed in January. We also need to do some additional modifications in the restrooms to bring them up to full ADA compatibility and work on the hot water heater in the custodian closet.



The rear glass windows are still going through changes, as our repeated attempts to effectively darken the windows have failed. We will be working on using a new window film tint on a couple of windows the first week of January to see if that gives us the desired effect we are wanting.

Overall we are very excited to see how beautiful the whole project has turned out and want to thank Sharon Cintas again for her beautiful color and decor ideas.

- Point to words and pictures so the child can follow
- Read the book repeatedly - children like that
- Encourage the child’s participation
- Remember that “reading time” may really be a request for “sit and cuddle” time
