

Renovation Updates

We continue to make progress despite seeming obstacles. Our current situation is this:

City Permits

The city has decided to hold up approval of our | architectural plans until certain power issues are resolved. Currently we have two cell sites located on our property (Sprint and T-Mobile) with a third provider (Verizon) wanting to get on board. The city recently informed us that until all three of these providers design a unified and approved plan for accessing electricity from Silicon Valley Power, they will not approve our plans. Thus we have had I to take the responsibility to get all three companies together to get these plans drawn up and approved.

Dave Wilson Jr., our Executive Administrative Assistant is "leading the charge" on this one. I ask for your prayers as he continues to work with all three carriers and the city to move this issue to completion. All participants will be meeting on Thursday, September 4 to begin this work.

Capital Fundraising- Background -Future Plans

Did you know our worship center was built in 1970? Since then considerable technological advances have been developed to improve the worship experience: hearing devices connected directly to the sound system allowing those with hearing impairments to enjoy the worship experience more fully, central air conditioning to break the heat, rear-projection technology which can improve the visibility of our song slides, sermon notes and videos, enhanced cluster speaker systems to eliminate audio "dead" and "hot" spots, and flexible seating that no longer limits the way we can arrange our sanctuary. A lot has changed. Some of these changes we've already been able to incorporate into our worship center, but many still need to be implemented.

Additionally a great deal of legislation has been passed in recent years describing how we should equip our facility to provide for maximum accessibility by all people. Various electrical codes and fire safety requirements have also changed. While we've certainly made some updates along the way, it's time once again for us to renovate the space where we worship and praise our Lord each week. • Over the past two years, the Renovation Team has

prayerfully developed a comprehensive plan to bring our facility up to date in terms of accessibility, safety, functionality and aesthetics. Our plans now lay in the hands of the city. The next phase of the renovation was the formation of a Capital Fundraising Team. This team, with guidance from Growing Healthy Churches (ABC of the West) Regional Consultants will develop the plan for us to finance the Renovation Project.

I was very thankful for the wisdom, experience, and insight we gained from these regional resource people. David Bennett is no stranger to our church. He has preached here and led various financial seminars for us. Bud Swank is a long-time staffer for our Region with extensive experience in church fundraising. Prince Altom (yes, Prince is his first name) has served as the senior pastor of Hillside Church of Marin for over 30 years. We are very fortunate to have such men guiding us in the achievement of God's goals for us.

After meeting with the regional consultants this past Sunday, the Capital Fundraising Team (Jerry Cintas, Karen Fong, Nikki Hawkins, Michelle Lasher, Steve McLenegan, Jay Nordgaard, Lisa Robinson, and Jess Stephens) is considering a two-year fundraising campaign. Pledges would be made and then fulfilled as soon as possible but not to exceed two years in length. In order to begin the project in a timely manner (pending city approval), the church would take out a loan to cover the necessary costs then repay the loan as pledges are fulfilled. Should this ultimately be the course of action the team determines to be best, it would bring a formal proposal regarding the loan details to the congregation for approval of the loan and the renovation it would underwrite.

Youth Director Search

The youth director search team is now in the process of collecting and reviewing applications for the position. They will keep us up to date about their progress.

I will continue to share progress reports as details become available. In the meantime, please pray with me, "God, what would you have me do for You today? How can I be part of this renovation and the rest of the Kingdom work You would have me do?"

Hello everyone,

The summer months are coming to an end, which means my Sabbatical is concluding as well. Looking back over the past 3 months, I can think of only one word to describe my summer experience – amazing. This has been an amazing summer for me and my family. Through your generosity, we were able to enjoy each other in a way that just isn't possible when both parents are working full time. We took several family vacations, spent many days at Raging Waters, stayed up too late, slept in too much, played lots of games, took lots of pictures, and made lots of memories. And the most noteworthy result of the summer - my house is clean and organized, and I've been cooking! Seriously. Of course, I benefitted greatly from this extended time of rest and renewal. However, my family gained just as much and we are all so grateful for this opportunity. Human Interest Features

Fred Marshall was born in Macon, Georgia on March 31, 1923 on the campus of Mercer University, a Baptist college. His father was a senior at that school and had rented rooms there in a Victorian home in which Fred was born. His father studied for the ministry and began a career that lasted 46 years serving numerous Baptist churches in Georgia and in the Army as a Chaplain in World War II. Fred grew up in Louisville, GA, along with two sisters and a brother. At the age of 10, his father became pastor in Tennille, GA, where Fred also attended high school. In the middle of his senior year in 1939, his father took a pastorate in LaGrange, GA, a step which greatly changed Fred's life.



Within a few weeks he met the most beautiful girl he had ever seen, Nell McCluskey, and it was love at first sight for them both. He then entered Mercer University and found that separation from Nell was too much and they were married in 1942. On graduation, Fred enlisted in the U. S. Navy and Fred, Jr was born during Fred's Navy training as an Electronics Technician. Fred served on a mine sweeper in the Pacific and was based in Japan following their surrender in 1945, clearing mines in the South China Sea. On returning home in 1946, he taught at Mercer University for a year before entering the Georgia Institute of Technology where he received a Master's Degree in Electrical Engineering in 1949. He then worked for the Bendix Radio Corporation in Baltimore, MD on missile guidance systems. His daughter, Betsy, was born there. He returned to Georgia Tech in 1952 where he spent 8 years in continued research for the Navy. His sons, Bob and David, were born in Atlanta, GA. The family was active in the First Baptist Church of Atlanta, where both Fred, Jr and Betsy were baptized.

In 1960, with school segregation a major issue, the governor of Georgia vowed to close Georgia Tech if any African American was admitted to the school. Fred strongly opposed segregation and he was offered a job in California at Stanford University, which he accepted. Moving his family to Sunnyvale, they sought a Baptist church and found this church. Among those welcoming them here were LeRoy and Dottie Reaves, also Georgia natives, and they continued as their closest friends. Fred became a member of the Diaconate and also taught Sunday School. In 1964, Ken Longmore became the pastor and Fred served as Chairman of the Diaconate, as the deacon for the Department of Membership, and as chairman of a committee to rewrite the church constitution.

In his position with Stanford University, Fred was engaged in research for the Air Force and Navy on missile defense systems. In 1970 his group moved to Stanford Research Institute because of the classified nature of that research. During his 31 years at Stanford and SRI, he traveled around the world, including Japan, England, Iceland, Greenland, Newfoundland, Denmark, Germany and the Aleutian Islands in Alaska, where he installed and tested long-range radar systems. Fred retired in 1991 at the age of 68 but has continued to travel the world as a tourist and an avid photographer.

Santa Clara First Baptist Church has played an important role in Fred's family. His sons, Bob and David, were baptized here and all four of his children were married here. Those marriages produced 9 grandchildren. His wife, Nell, was also very active in the church and was beloved by all who knew her. Sadly, she suffered a heart attack in December 1985 and passed away following surgery in February 1986 at the young age of 61 after 43 years of marriage. She left written plans for her funeral, asking that a single daffodil from her garden be placed on her casket. That was done and each year since then for 22 years, that same clump of daffodils has bloomed near the date of her death and one of those blossoms has been placed in the sanctuary here in her memory.

Fred says that his greatest legacy will be his large family, which now numbers 24 members, including 9 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren. God has richly blessed his life.
