## **People of Interest**

Harold and Wilma have called Santa Clara First Baptist Church their church home for 44 years. They moved to San Jose in 1964 when Western Electric transferred Harold here. They have two children, Bill and Debbie and two grandsons, Michael and Mark.

Wilma was born in Glasgow, Montana. When she was three, her family moved to a small farm near Spokane. She began her education in a one-room schoolhouse! When her father became employed in Spokane, they moved to the city. She finished her elementary and high school years in Spokane. She always wanted to teach, so she earned her B.A. degree in Home Economics Education at Washington State and taught at Glover Junior High in Spokane.

Harold, a twin, also grew up in Spokane. After his education, he enlisted in the Navy during World War II. He was assigned to a Patrol Craft Sub-chaser and served an 18-month tour in Guam. He finished his tour in the San Francisco area. After the Navy, he returned to his job as an installer for Western Electric.

Harold and Wilma both grew up in Christian homes and attended the same church since they were both children. However, they never really met each other until they worked on a church Christmas pageant in 1958. They married in 1960. In 1964, Harold was promoted to an associate engineer, so they left their families and close friends and moved to San Jose.

After arriving here, they soon knew Santa Clara First Baptist Church would be their new church home. They immediately joined the choir and have been singing in it ever since. Wilma also taught the pre-kindergarten class for about 15 years. When the new sanctuary was being built, Dr. Miller approached her to begin a Children's choir for the dedication service. The choir continued for many more years singing for holiday programs.

Harold served on the property Department of Diaconate while the sanctuary was being built. He also assisted in their Opportunity Class for the mentally challenged. When the church began a bus ministry, he drove the bus and would pick up neighborhood children and bring them to Sunday School. He also drove youth to camps and the seniors on field trips. Both have served on numerous church committees.

They are thankful that both children, Bill and Debbie, have grown up in the Lord and serve in this church. Their grandsons, Michael and Mark also attend here. They were thrilled to watch Mark be baptized in the same baptistry where his mother and uncle were baptized.

## Missionary Update from the Chapman's

My reason for going to Mbonga Malembe was to be with Pastor Ndungu and his family. Ndungu just graduated in June. This is his first church, and his first "Matondo" or Thanksgiving service. The church has suffered in recent years, so he is in a real rebuilding mode, only trying to put a building up, but also establishing a committee and church leaders. He has one old deaconess. I was pleased that the high school principal is the pastor's right hand man. The two will work well together. I was proud to see another one of our former student families established, in place and at work.

The pastor's wife, and one of Rita's former students has a women's group gathered, and their group was one of the choirs.

Speaking of choirs, there were six choirs for the first round who were asked to sing two songs each. Plus, the choirs do an "intro" where they sing on the way up. I was scheduled to preach, so I asked them to have me preach before the second round of choirs. Usually, the slot for the message is after all the choirs sing. By that hour, people are tired and the choir members have begun to leave. I preached on the church at Antioch, using Acts 13:1. I spoke about Simeon, who was "called the black" (Good News Bible) and "Lucius from Cyrene", another African leader in the church. I talked about how Africa and Africans have influenced the Bible, and how God sent his Son for the whole world, and not just for one race or one nationality. My pride is not in being an American, or not in the name that people often call me "Le Blanc" (the white), but my pride is being called a "Christian" as believers first got the title at Antioch- a church that was started by missionaries from Cyprus and Cyrene (Africans) (Acts 11:20).

The service ended after 2 PM. We began before 9 AM. Some of the people told me that their offering wasn't as much as it could have been because they had gotten out too early! Offering time is such an animated time, that they want it to go on and on so that they can keep giving little by little. The offering came to over \$120. That is a big offering for a village and they knew it and were proud of it!
