LENT 2009 BECAUSE IT'S TIME

The season of Lent has traditionally been that special time in the Christian calendar in which we commit ourselves to taking further steps of personal growth in Christ. All of us want to "get better" in one or more life areas, but our busy lifestyles seem to leave no opportunity for us to take the time to concentrate on personal development.

Lent offers such a time. During Lent our entire church family is presented with a common growth plan which offers a focused, clear path for growth.

This year's theme is "Because It's Time". We experience time as a series of events, strung together in a linear fashion. But, within these never-ending ticks of the clock, certain moments appear which are pregnant with possibilities. The Bible writers refer to these occasions by the term "in the fullness of time". It was in the fullness of time that God sent His Son into the world to redeem us (Galatians 4:4). Jesus announced that the time was fulfilled for the Kingdom to arrive (Mark 1:15). What "time" is it for you?

The following sections explain the upcoming opportunities you'll have to discover the answer to that question for yourself.

Person of Interest,

I was born in Spokane, Washington and moved to San Jose when Western Electric transferred my father to California in 1964. I have been attending Santa Clara First Baptist Church ever since and was baptized at this church on May 8, 1977.

The church has been a very important part of my life, and many of the people who attended this church influenced the person I would

become. When I was five-years-old I began singing in the children's choir and around the age of ten, I performed in my first children's choir musical, "The Boy Who Caught the Fish" by Betty Wernersbach. At age 16, I had my first opportunity to tour some of the western states with the Santa Clara First Baptist Church youth choir called, "The Salvation Sowers", led by Bruce Simpkins.



My interest in music continued to grow during this time and I began writing music. With the influence of songwriter and adult choir director, Ron Soderwall, I decided to write an anthem for our youth choir called, "Thank You Lord", that was sung on May 21,1978 during the Family Worship Service. I continued to write music, but shifted my writing to children's music. In 1979 the David C. Cook publishing company published my first song and several years later they hired me to write songs for their 1987-88 teaching packets. A few years ago, I did some writing and recording work that turned several Bible verses into short songs that teachers can use with preschool children to promote scripture memory.

Paul and Trina Vossen were also church members who shaped my interest in music. Paul created the music group, "Shekinah", and I have had an opportunity to sing in this group ever since.

Another area of my life that was greatly shaped by the Church was my interest and passion in teaching young children. As a teenager, I had an opportunity to assist in the four- and five-year-old Sunday School Class (now known as the Sonshiners class). I also volunteered to work during VBS as an assistant. It wasn't long before I began to feel that God was leading me into the field of Early Childhood Education. In 1980, I began taking classes in ECE at De Anza College and later completed my A.A. in the field of Human Development. After my first year of classes the Lord opened the door for me to work at De Anza as a one-year full replacement for a teacher that would be out on a sabbatical that year. By the end of my contract, the center went through some changes that opened another opportunity for me to work indefinitely as a part-time teacher at the school. My job was to educate young children and work closely with the families and help train students. With the support of my family, colleagues, and faculty I was able to continue with my education and received my B.A. degree in Human Development at Pacific Oaks College. I have worked full time at the center for 28 years.

Before working full-time at De Anza I worked for a variety of other centers on a part-time basis. After working at the Christian Daycare Center located at our church, I was led to Bethel Lutheran School in Cupertino where I worked for 12 years. At this center I was able to combine my teaching with my love for God.

Currently at Santa Clara First Baptist I am still involved in Shekinah and the Choir. I am also still teaching Sunday School to the first graders, a ministry that I have been privileged enough to teach for almost 30 years! I have a faithful friend and assistant in Pat Graham, who has been with me for 12 years. With the use of the web, I have been able to expand my Sunday School ministry over the internet, and have developed the Sonshiners web page, (www.angelfire.com/ca/sonshiners), that shares our weekly activities with those who are not able to come on Sunday. At Bethlehem, if you see the angel, that's me. I've been doing it for seven years

Our congregation is very blessed to have a man like Bill Wright who loves us and the Lord!


