Because It's Time- to Renovate

Our Because It's Time theme for both the Lenten season and our Capital Fund-Raising Campaign highlights an important concept- at certain times in our lives something special occurs.

After nine months of gestation, it's time for a baby to be born. After four years of study, it's time to graduate from high school. After 21 years of life, you are eligible to vote.

In each of these instances the assumption is that the proper time of preparation has past. Now is the time to reap the benefits or take up the responsibilities.

After two years of preparation by our Renovation Team now is the time for us to proceed with our Fund-Raising Campaign. As I stated in my Annual Report the fact that our economy is in such a mess is no coincidence. God foresaw all of this. He knew about this juncture of events. He is not surprised.

He has definitely blessed our work up to this point. The plans that we have created are well thought out. And our renovation effort is a worthy cause. We want to enhance both the appearance and functionality of our 40 year old facilities so that they will communicate to newcomers that we have a 21st century message to give to them.

God blesses those who step out in faith. When the Israelites crossed the Jordan River to enter the Promised Land God caused the river to dry up and they walked across on dry land. But they could have occupied the Land 40 years before. Forty years previously when Moses sent the 12 spies into the Land ten returned with a negative report. "We can't attack those people; they are stronger than we are. We seemed like grasshoppers in our own eyes, and we looked the same to them."

But Caleb and Joshua stood up and tried to turn the people back to trusting in their God, "And do not be afraid of the people of the land, because we will swallow them up. Their protection is gone, but the LORD is with us. Do not be afraid of them."

But the people allowed fear to overcome their trust in God's provision and so they missed the blessing of God for 40 years.

In our day we face giant economic obstacles to generous giving. Before the economy plunged our people were ready to give out of their plenty. Savings accounts, retirement accounts, market investments were flush for many of us. Now we, like the Jews of the past, must trust God to provide for our ability for us to give significant gifts.

But this is where God delights to show forth His glory. Just recently I spoke with one of our laymen who told me that quite in expectantly he just received an 11% raise! He never saw it coming. With this economy one wouldn't even consider the possibility. But there it is.

To prepare ourselves to give generously I ask that we all continue to pray daily the campaign prayer, "Lord, what would you have me do to contribute to this great effort?" Allow Him to give you His answer and then watch Him work His amazing grace in your life for His glory.


Youth News

Mexico Outreach 2009

Plans are already underway for our annual weeklong trip to Ensenada, Mexico. This year's trip will be from June 20th to June 28th. This trip, a life changing trip for many, will be led this year by Fion Cheng and Tim McLenegan. The cost of the trip will be \$400, but many fundraisers will be held leading up to the trip. This trip is open to anyone completing 8^{th} grade or higher, and adults are welcome as well.





I was born in Napa, CA. My family later lived in Visalia and then Corning before moving to Campbell, where my sister was born. We lived in a small apartment next door to my aunt and uncle which was a lot of fun. They didn't have any children at that time, so I became their child for some special events. One of these events was to raise money for the veterans of World War II. I became the local poster child because I sold more yellow paper poppies than the guys. I partnered with my uncle and he won the contest. This same organization also gave me an opportunity to sing my first and only solo which was at a Christmas party for the children of the veterans.

My parents bought their home in the Willow Glen area when I was six years old. Eventually my aunt and uncle had two girls of their own so I schools, and in the Methodist church. My mother encouraged us to attend Sunday School and church services. My mother also sang in the

had three sisters, not just one. I sang in choirs in elementary and high Pat & Richard Graham church choir. My father attended church on special occasions and encouraged us to read the Bible with him on Sunday afternoons. I don't remember experiencing a true conversion to Christ; it was like believing the sun will come up tomorrow. You just knew it would! For me, Christ is like that. He is someone to believe in without question.

After graduation from high school, I went to work for Pacific Bell/AT&T as a long-distance operator. I didn't attend church for a while because I usually worked Sundays. The pay on Sundays was time and a half and I was saving for college. My dream job was to become a school teacher or an airline attendant. I met my husband one Sunday at work. If you called "POPCORN" in the summer of 1964 to find out what time it was, you would hear my voice! I worked for the telephone company for 38 years before retiring in January, 2002. I then found another career as a receptionist in a financial service office and still work full-time.

In 1966 I was introduced to church again by my mother and went back to the Methodist church for a time, but we both discovered this wasn't the church we needed. I found Blossom Hill Baptist Church through my aunt and sang in the choir before coming to SCFBC in 1989 (and joining the choir!). About fifteen years ago someone asked if I would be interested in teaching Sunday School and I co-taught/substituted for a while. A couple of years later I was asked to be a substitute for Bill Wright's class. I have co-taught ever since (about 13 years now). My faith has grown while working in the classroom.

I have also taught in AWANA for about ten years as a Cubbie leader (pre-school age) and worked on the Manna team through last year. Bethlehem has also become a favorite of mine. I feel I am making a difference just by doing the small things. Everyone is important and God reinforces this daily. I have truly been blessed by my church family!
