Discipleship- Are We Selling Cheap Grace?

When we share our faith, we can easily fall into the trap of relying on catchphrases—expressions that have become so overused, that the true meaning is blurred. Sometimes, a phrase gets so overused that its words are taken as gospel itself. In relying so heavily on Christian buzzwords and phrases, could we

be guilty of dumbing down biblical truth in order to simplify the gospel and make it more palatable for nonbelievers?

Surprising to some, the phrase, "accept Jesus", or "ask Jesus into your heart", is not found in the Bible. There is, however, a whole lot about denying ourselves and following Jesus. In the evangelical community, the goal seems to be to get a person to commit (pray the prayer, or seal the deal), and hit them with the "fine print" about being a dedicated follower later.

But passage after passage attests to the truth that Jesus invites us to live our lives in the kingdom of God, following him 24/7. He does not invite us to "pray a prayer of salvation", and then fit church into our busy schedules for the rest of our lives.

Grace Alone?

At this point, some might be feeling a little defensive and wanting to point out that the Bible says grace, not works, is what saves us. This is absolutely true, and the verse they probably have in mind is Ephesians 2:8-9: "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast."

Unfortunately, most stop there and don't pay attention to the next verse 10: "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

Grace and good works are inseparable. It is grace that saves us, and it saves us for the purpose of serving God actively for the rest of our lives. In *Not a Fan*, Kyle Idleman writes, "We tend to define belief as the acceptance of something as real or true. But biblical belief is more than just an intellectual acceptance or a heartfelt acknowledgment; it is a commitment to follow."

So What has God Done for You?

It is too easy to rely on lingo and buzzwords when we try to share our faith. Jesus repeatedly encouraged people to share their own stories of what God has done for them. This takes some soul-searching and a little effort, but the results are far more effective for introducing not-yet-believers to the wonderful life God want them to experience.
