



Back in the summer of 2005 Susi and I drove across the United States and back. We took one route going east and another on the return drive. We were able to see a lot of this wonderful country of ours, watch our son Andrew graduate from the US Naval Academy, and visit with both friends and family along the way. But, I must say...It was good to get back home as well.

To complete any significant journey is a satisfying accomplishment. This has certainly been true as it relates to our Renovation Project. For years we have been dreaming, planning, and working on a renovation plan to bring our facilities up to date and make them more effective in ministry, more welcoming to newcomers and ADA compliant.

At our May 17 Quarterly Business Meeting our congregation approved the Renovation plans by a unanimous vote. This vote came on the heels of an amazing outpouring of generosity by our church congregation on First Gifts Sunday when we received \$162,923 towards the project.

And so, as we have finished the preparation phase of the Renovation, we have now begun a new journey - the Renovation itself. This journey will also be a long one. We currently estimate it will take two years to complete.

In actuality we will be able to proceed as fast as the pledges come in. Over half of the pledged amount has already been given. This has given us a great boost at the beginning and the work has already begun. (See Jerry Cintas' article for the actual Renovation progress report)

This Renovation will bring changes to our facilities. It will dislocate our ministries at times. It will make the place look and feel different. At times we may feel anxious, frustrated, or just plain out of sorts.

To help deal with these feelings, I'd like to suggest the following thought to remember while we travel down this new road, "*There is joy in the journey*". I can say that because the Savior of the world joins us in this journey. And when He is present, His love, joy, and peace are not far away. Make sure to stop along the way often and receive His abundant gifts. He can make this new journey a lot more pleasant for us all.

Finance Committee Report

Since the February Family Gathering the financial condition of the church has improved! As we compare giving year-to-date, General Fund Giving is nearly identical to last year at the same time (4/30/2009); in fact, within \$100.00 (this excludes contributions toward the Renovation Project). Considering the current economic times this is good, however compared to the actual budget we are still down from our hopeful projections by \$20,000.00 year-to-date.

The budget projections are based upon growth of the church which includes missions and various outreach programs. Just like many of our personal finances though, our expenses seem to be rising and a stagnant growth in revenue is gradually pulling us into the red. It is positive to note that we are definitely in an improved condition compared to February. However, as of April 30th we have still experienced a year-to-date loss of approximately \$8,000.00, despite the loss, the financial condition of the Church is sound.

The Finance Committee has requested that all expenses be reviewed to minimize excess spending and will be implementing guidelines to help manage expenses. There are two basic components to any budget: Income and Expenses. It is the church leadership's and staff's responsibility to manage and minimize expenses. But it is the membership that has the primary control of giving.

As has been witnessed with the Capital Fund Raising Program, the membership's generosity to this church is strong and committed. But please remember that it is our tithes and offerings that help this Church to spread God's Word.

Are you looking for a ministry where you can serve the Lord and His church? Please consider the following:

Prayer Chain - This ministry provides prayer support for our church family. Betty Hastings 866-1551 is the coordinator of a group who pass on prayer requests over the phone. Call Betty if you are interested in being a "link" in the chain or whenever you have a prayer request. There is also an email prayer chain that travels to approximately 90 households. You may email Jim Lovelace at deloys@aol.com if you would like to participate or have a prayer request.

Hospital Visitation – This involves visiting people and their families in the hospital when necessary. If you would like to help in the area where you live, give Jeri Cooper (984-0908) a call.

Shut-in Visitation and Communion –

Maxine Darknell (252-7567) leads this ministry of visitation. More people are needed who would be willing to visit once or twice a month. Communion is served to our shut-ins by alternating pastors about three times a year.

Shut-in CD Ministry – Currently we are looking for someone to coordinate this ministry. Our Sunday Services are on the website at www.scfbc.org but not everyone has access to them. We would like to have the sermons once again duplicated on CDs and sent out to shut-ins and people who request them. If you can help on Monday or Tuesday, please call Dave in the office 241-7635 to volunteer.

Bereavement Meals and Memorial Receptions –

When there is a need, we try to help by offering meals, etc, coordinated by Doris Smith (241-5299) and Maxine Darknell (241-7567). If anyone hears of a death in our church family and would like to help with food, please contact the church office, Doris or Maxine.

Illness meals – This ministry is coordinated by individual Life Group Leaders as needed for illness in the family or for hospital stays of their groups participants. Call your Life Group leader when you have a need or notify the church office with your request.

Church Meal Functions – Adam Burdick 230-6828 coordinates this ministry referred to as "Manna". They can always use more help cooking and cleaning at Quarterly Family Gatherings, Worship in the Park and other functions. Manna is "here to serve".

Church Membership and/or Baptism - If you have been wondering how to become a member of Santa Clara First Baptist Church, ask either Pastor Rich or Pastor Jenny for more information. Membership is not a requirement for attending SCFBC but if you are a member it means that you are able to serve in more ways and participate in the voting at the Quarterly Business meetings.

Fellowship Fund - This fund is available to those needing financial assistance. You may donate to this special ministry by designating "Fellowship Fund" and the amount you wish to give on your offering envelope.

Food Pantry - Through the food pantry we supply bags of food to help meet the needs of people who stop by the church office. You can give money for this ministry by designating "Food Pantry" and amount on your offering envelope. We also accept canned and packaged food, such as tuna, peanut butter, spaghetti sauce, pasta, canned fruit and vegetables, in addition to the paper bags with handles. These items can be placed in the wooden box in the lobby.

Good Samaritans - This is a ministry of "helps" for those who need assistance with some of their basic needs in their homes but do not have anyone to help them. This could be small home repairs or cleaning, yard work, mending, driving people to appointments, picking up prescriptions or relieving a caregiver. Please call Maxine Darknell (241-7567) if you have some time to give once or twice a year or if you have a need.

Sunday Fellowship – Our after Worship refreshments time is coordinated by Maxine Darknell and Doris Smith for Morning Worship and Michelle Lasher for EDGE Worship. 

Giving by Bill Clinton. (Section #9) Yes, this book by the former President, he challenges Americans to get involved in volunteering and helping others in the world starting with people at home. It is much like the book above, <u>You Can Change the World</u> but on an adult level. There are many ideas and websites to get you and your family motivated.

Pastor's Pick: <u>Shame Off You</u> by Alan D. Wright. (Section #13) As Gary Chapman author of <u>The Five Love Languages</u> said, "The world is filled with people who walk with their heads down. Shame has enslaved them. The author has now given us a book on shame that is readable and believable. <u>Shame Off You</u> will help many people find relief from guilt and the gnawing sense or lie called "shame" that whispers, they're "not good enough."
