Two Questions for God's Church

A number of years ago Peter Drucker, the most respected business analyst of the 20th century and a committed Christian, posed two questions that every organization needs to ask itself. While they sound simple enough, they will provoke profound thought and can cause a serious reconsideration of an organization's direction. They are:

What business are we in? How's business?

For the local church the first question finds its answer in the Great Commission Jesus gave to His disciples following the resurrection.

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Matthew 28:18-20 (NIV)

The business of God's church is twofold: to recruit people into God's Kingdom as they accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior and to enable these new "Kingdom citizens" to grow into maturity as committed followers of Jesus.

At SCFBC we state this mission as follows: To evangelize and disciple the people of the Santa Clara Valley.

So much for the business we're engaged in. Now we must ask, "How's business?" If we were in the widget making business, we'd ask: "How are we doing in producing widgets?" "What quality widgets are we making?" "What can we do to improve our work?"

In the church we must ask similar questions: "How are we doing in winning people to Jesus?" "How many baptisms are occurring?" "How many new members are joining our church?" "What kind of spiritual growth do we see in the current members of our church family?" "What can we do to improve our efforts toward these ends?"

These are tough questions because they force us to seriously evaluate our current efforts and deal uncompromisingly with the results.

Since we have begun our church's physical renovation we can see the progress occurring. What we must turn our attention to now is our church's spiritual renovation. It's time to begin renovating our hearts and our ministries so we can see progress in accomplishing the spiritual business of the Kingdom.

To this end, immediately following our Family VBS series, I'll be preaching a series on SCFBC's Spiritual Renovation. I look forward to pursuing God's vision for our church family together with you.

BOOK SALE RESULTS – Thank you SCFBC for your generous book donations! Special thanks to Dan Harrell, Ken Harrell, John Harrell, Cyndi O'Sullivan, Michelle Lasher, Sharon Cintas, Denise Stephens, Marlene Goldman, and Ellen Imhof for moving, setting up, and selling books. The SCFBC library was truly blessed with an abundance of book donations for the June Book Sale. Not only did our library shelves benefit with new books, but SCFBC donated about 50 pounds of books and \$250 to Centro Educativo Bautista del Carbe, the school ministry of New Hope Church in Limon, Costa Rica. Even after the Book Sale, God's blessings did not stop as other organizations also benefitted:

- About 200 Christian books were bought by or donated to Sovereign Grace Baptist Church in Modesto, CA for their library startup.
- Approximately 100 audio book tapes were donated to the Santa Clara Center for the Blind on Bascom Avenue in San Jose
- Two local trade book stores purchased books, paying SCFBC \$244 in store credit for future book purchases.
- Books Go Round, Salvation Army, and Goodwill received books and VHS tapes to sell in their stores.
- Donating books to Savers returned 20%-off coupons for future book purchases.
- RAFT, a low cost teacher supply center, received a box of usable National Geographic magazines.





Person of Interest, **Margery Torres**

Margery was born on May 27, 1916, in El Paso, Texas. When she moved to California as a child with her parents and three sisters, they worked in various farming fields along the way and finally settled in Oakland where Marge was She graduated from raised. Oakland High School and was married at the age of 17.

During World War II, Marge worked in the Richmond and Oakland shipyards as one of the original "Rosie the Riveters". When her husband left her, she took on a second job at a creamery near the shipyards to support her



daughter. She soon met John Torres, a single father with a son, and they were married in 1942. John and Marge added two more daughters and three more sons to their blended family.

Marge always wanted to be a hairdresser, so in her 40's she finally seized the opportunity and went to beauty college to obtain her license.. She did so well in school that the owners of the college asked her to teach there. For the next ten years she taught and loved it, but in 1969 decided to open her own shop, Lady Princess on Lincoln Avenue in Willow Glen.

Marge and John were very involved in their community, helping people prepare for US citizenship and helping the poor get the benefits they needed. She hosted voting booths in her house every year in the late 50's and most of the 60's. She also became known for her great tamales!

In 1975 Marge and John were invited to Santa Clara First Baptist Church by Betty Downing and both were baptized here. Later when John became very ill, Marge stayed home and took care of him until he passed away in 1996. Then she returned to SCFBC once again.

Marge turned 93 this year and now lives with one of her daughters, Linda. She still comes to worship on Sunday mornings and participates in the Seniors Monday Morning Life Group unless her health problems keep her from doing so.

Thank you, Marge, for the years of your faithful service to God, SCFBC and your community.

Parlor Renovation Update

The parlor renovation is nearing completion. The drywall is up and mudding is taking place. The City inspectors approved the electrical, plumbing, framing, and sheetrock work. The parlor should be completed by mid July with new lighting, carpet, paint, counters,

refrigerator, microwave, cabinets, tile, and coffee maker.





The ABW work room is being converted into a general purpose storage room with entry doors from the

sanctuary and parlor. As part of that renovation, new storage cabinets were purchased for the ABW ministry and are now located in rooms 19 and 20.

Plans are being made to install the fire alarm system in the next month. Since the wiring for the system covers the entire sanctuary building, it might require creating some new holes in walls and ceilings. This should be done before the painting of those areas is completed.
