# Haiti Relief Update

American Baptist International Ministries (IM) missionaries, Christian partners and U.S. and Puerto Rico congregations are continuing to mobilize and respond at historic levels to the 7.0 earthquake that struck Haiti and devastated its capital Port-au-Prince and the surrounding area on January 12th. To date IM has provided a total of \$65,000 One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) funds for Haiti.

IM missionary Dr. Steve James and IM's Christian partners, including the Haitian Baptist Convention and the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, are collaborating to provide medical care and relief supplies at Christianville, the quake epicenter approximately 20 miles southwest of Port-au-Prince. Nancy James, a registered nurse, is in Haut Limbe in the north of Haiti, maintaining the critical communication link with her husband Steve and the outside world.

Kristy Engel, a pediatric nurse practitioner serving in the Dominican Republic (a country that boarders Haiti), has taken a 75-person team, including 30 medical personnel, into Haiti. The group, which includes **Ketly and Vital Pierre,** IM missionaries to Nicaragua, traveled into Haiti on January 16th to provide emergency care at three clinics and to distribute six truckloads of food and medical supplies.

In the meantime, IM missionary Madeline Flores-Lopez and Dominican Republic partners are providing medical care, shelter and relief supplies to quake victims arriving at the Contreras Hospital in Santo Domingo.

Jose Norat-Rodriguez, IM area director of Iberoamerica and the Caribbean, states: "We are witnessing a monumental effort that is marked by a historic collaboration between IM global partners and missionaries from a variety of countries."

Thousands of American Baptist congregations from the U.S. and Puerto Rico are responding through prayer and giving. Offerings are being received through One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS), which is a vital way for Christians to respond to people, regardless of faith tradition, in the grip of disaster.

In the first two Sundays of our special OGHS offering our church has given \$2,737. We will continue to receive this offering into February. We will also be looking into sending a mission team to Haiti sometime later in the year to help with rebuilding.

The lobby is looking great as final paint and trim are being installed. Adam Burdick and Tom Caldwell have been working on the large doors by stripping them and sanding them so the new paint will hold for a long time. Lloyd Darknell installed the new energy efficient fluorescents and center lobby pendant light. We are still playing with the color temperature of the lights so you will see some changes there next week. We are using the lobby center area as a paint room for working on the doors and might keep it that way for 2 more weeks so we can paint all the large doors of the sanctuary, including the side entrances. Because of this we are holding off on the lobby carpet for a couple of weeks. We are also working on new signage for the lobby with pleasing bronze finishes.

We have contracted with the sound and lighting company to get them online for installing the new sanctuary speakers, sound equipment, and projection screen. We know this is a ways out but needed to get them setup for this year.

Thanks again to all the volunteers who have been coming down to help. Also keep those pledges coming in so we can complete this renovation on schedule.

# 2010 Census National Advertising Campaign Set to Begin:

As part of this monumental effort Santa Clara First Baptist will donate space in room 29, Monday - Thursday from 1pm to 6pm to answer questions concerning the census forms. We expect the Census Bureau to set up at the church beginning March 19th thru April 19th, this service will be offered to the entire community.

During the next four months, the tour will be part of the largest civic outreach and awareness campaign in U.S. history -- stopping and exhibiting at more than 800 events nationwide. From local parades and festivals to major sporting events like the Super Bowl and NCAA Final Four, the Census Bureau will attempt to motivate America's growing and increasingly diverse population to complete and mail back 10-question census forms when they arrive in mailboxes March 15-17.

"The Road Tour seeks to educate and empower every person living across our country to take part and participate in the 2010 Census," Census Bureau Director Robert Groves said. "Attendees at Road Tour events will learn about the census, how it affects their local communities and even share their personal stories about why the census is important to them at interactive kiosks and exhibits."

The regional vehicles offer a similar user experience, including GPS technology that allows visitors to track the tour online as it happens and through daily social media postings on Twitter, Facebook, MySpace, Flickr and YouTube.

Regional launch events include vehicles departing from national landmarks across the nation, such as the USS Constitution in Boston, Independence Mall in Philadelphia, the Gateway Arch in St. Louis, Santa Monica Pier in Los Angeles and the Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco. Altogether, more than 3 million people will have the opportunity to share their photos and stories, explaining why the census will make a difference in their communities. This constantly changing "portrait of America" will be captured during all Road Tour events and will live online at 2010census.gov.

### A LETTER RECENTLY RECEIVED FROM LAURAN BETHELL

Dear Friends at SCFB,

I'm sitting in front of my beautiful Christmas tree in my apartment in Holland, a sleeping cat in my lap, hoping that it will snow before I leave to spend Christmas with my family in California! In these unusually peaceful moments at home, I'm enjoying think of each of you, and how grateful I am for your support and caring for me in so many ways: your prayers, your kind words and thoughts, your gifts and financial offerings. Though you don't hear from me very often, please know that I am so thankful for you. I hope that you know how important you are to this Ministry to which God has called me to—no us!



This 9th year as a "Global Consultant", I've traveled more than 125, 000 miles: North American, Latin America, Caribbean, Central Asia, and Europe. I attended many meetings, both small and large, being the "Plenary Speaker", or a workshop leader, or Committee Member or Guess Preacher. The major goal: to call attention to prostitution and trafficking of human beings and ask the question "where would Jesus be in the midst of this?" My hope is always that people would answer that question by responding in some way, following God's leading in their own lives, participating in ministries, beginning new ones. I especially enjoy the personal interactions, counseling and prayer time with individuals who are feeling passionate about the call to ministry that they are experiencing.

When I'm home in Holland, I volunteer with two Dutch organizations which meet women in prostitution in the brothels where they work. One of these organizations has made contact with Thai women in "massage parlors" and I am enjoying getting to know these dear women, speaking Thai with them, giving them Thai music CD's and tracts. One of the "madams" told me that she knew about Jesus, and attended church when she lived in Thailand. She says that she listens to the CD's when she's sad, and finds great peace in their message. She talks about wanting to close her parlor and do something else with her life. I pray that she will recognize the Jesus that she once knew and make life-changing decisions.

In recent months, I've had a teenager living with me—a young woman whose mother was victim of sex trafficking and who died last year of leukemia (some of you know Sasja's story). "D" now has no family and lots of "risk factors". She's started attending vocational school and my prayer is that she will find true Hope for her future. Please pray with me about our time together, that she will experience Jesus' love for her.

# Person of Interest, Virginia Newcomb

Virginia was born in Salinas, California on May 23, 1931. She grew up in King City, California, the daughter of teachers. Her father taught American History and Civics in the local high school, and her mother, a former teacher, taught piano at home. Virginia attended the K-8 elementary school, was a Girl Scout, and babysat and did housecleaning to earn extra money. The family spent many summers in Oregon, where they owned a cabin on the coast in Tillamook County. They would play host to the many Oregon relatives while there. Good times were had by all!



The family was active in the King City Community Baptist Church, and Virginia was baptized there when she was 12 years old. While in BFY she attended Mount Hermon during the summer. During

high school, she was a member of the Rainbow Girls. After graduation, Virginia attended San Jose State College, and during summers worked at the King City Greyhound bus depot as a waitress in the cafe. The passengers had only thirty minutes to be served and eat, so it was rush, rush, rush time!

Virginia graduated with a major in Elementary School Education and a minor in Music. She taught school in Santa Maria, California for four years and then moved to San Diego, where she taught for three years. During her time in San Diego she met her future husband, Charles, a Marine. They were married in 1959 in King City. They continued living in San Diego where their son Bill was born. They moved to San Jose where Charles was employed by Lockheed and Teredyne. Their daughter Linda was born in San Jose. They moved two times, and soon were living on Benton Street in Santa Clara. Virginia and the children began attending First Baptist Church. Kenneth Longmore was the pastor and the church met in the Fellowship Hall. After three years, the family moved back to San Jose. Virginia joined the fellowship at Blossom Hill Baptist Church. During this time the marriage ended and Virginia became a single parent. She had gone back to school and studied to become a school librarian, and was employed by Franklin-McKinley School District. She rededicated her life to the Lord in 1980.

Blossom Hill Baptist Church closed its doors in 1989 and Virginia and others followed Pastor Bob Wernersbach to Santa Clara First Baptist. It was like coming back home for Virginia!
