

## Renovation Update!

We have officially moved into the Sanctuary part of the remodel. After many long, passionate discussions we have decided to remove the paneling on the lower walls. We performed a lot of electrical work in those walls with additional outlets, dimmable wall sconces, fire alarm strobes, lighting control switches, and moving the thermostat to a more convenient location. Plus we insulated the walls to help more with sound blocking to the adjacent clasrooms.



Adam Burdick and Nick Seely did a great job of demolishing and hanging the new drywall. Lloyd Darknell, Tim McLenegan, and Jerry Cintas ran all the electrical circuits and conduits for the wall. We hired a drywall guy to mud and sand the walls, and Tom Caldwell came in to do the final painting. The walls passed city inspections and the finished product looks great and has

significantly brightened up the Sanctuary.

We had a problem with the double

doors we ordered for the back of the Sanctuary but the correct ones should be arriving soon. We will also begin work on the new sound booth and placing a door where the glass window is at the back of the Sanctuary.



Your continued donations and pledges for this project are what is keeping this renovation going. We hope you have seen what a remarkable transformation has taken place

already in the Lobby, Parlor, and restrooms. We plan to continue with the same quality of workmanship and design as we tackle the Sanctuary's interior. Keep those pledges and donations coming so we can fully complete the work of renovating the facilities God has given us.
