- Help pack the bags and boxes to be sent.



Financial Update

At the May Quarterly Meeting, it was presented to the membership that our church was in a very precarious position financially. At that time, financial information indicated that we were operating at a net loss of \$23,373.00 as of April 30th. Although expenses have been well-managed, the primary cause of the loss was a decrease in giving. As of April 30th, (compared to April 30, 2009), giving was down by \$24,398.05. The membership was advised of our condition and each was asked to consider their individual giving towards the ministries of SCFBC. We were each asked to consider increasing our giving.

Your church leadership is quite pleased to share with you that in May giving was up significantly! Contributions in May totaled \$49,126.97! Thanks to the generosity of our membership and others who worship with us, nearly 90% of our net loss was erased. As of May 31st, we are still operating at a net loss, but that loss has been reduced to \$2,502.40. We all should be encouraged by this positive change in our financial position. At the same time, we still need to remain cautious not to become complacent in serving God through our giving. We need to stay aware of the continuous financial challenges that remain a constant for Santa Clara First Baptist Church.

Renovation Update

Work is continuing on the new sound booth at the rear of the sanctuary. Adam Burdick and Duane Esquibel have been working hard on the construction of the walls and floor. We have the siding up and the drywall sanded and are working on the final painting of the outside. At the time of this publication, the inside is still waiting for carpet, paneling, counters and handrails. As soon as we get the finishing touches done, we will be moving the existing sound equipment in and tearing down the old booth.

We have also been experimenting with finding a cost effective large ceiling pendant that we can hang in the sanctuary to provide more lighting on the congregation seating area. We have a sample in the back that we are evaluating for brightness and aesthetics. Our goal is to reduce the amount of fluorescent fixtures by placing eight dimmable ceiling pendants in the room.

A revised set of architectural plans are at the city offices right now being reviewed which shows updates to the stage area and rear projection screens. The updates add a second screen to the right side of the stage to help bring

symmetry to the stage and also provide easier viewing of sermon and song slides. The update also improves on the stairs to access the stage by moving them in towards the center a little more and rounding the stair wells to match the stage front arc. The city also wanted to see better detail on the fire ratings of all of our walls in the sanctuary building, so we produced better documentation in the revised set.

Your continued donations and pledges to this project are what is keeping all this going and we hope you have seen what a remarkable transformation has taken place already in the lobby, parlor, and restrooms. We plan to continue with the same quality of workmanship and design as we continue to work on the sanctuary interior. Keep those donations coming so we can fully complete the work we have started.

She has also owned an art gallery and a custom frame shop and currently is an apprentice sky painter.
