The good news is that all of our plans have now been turned over to the City of Santa Clara for their inspection and approval. We can expect the next stages to look something like this:

- The city gives its approval to our plans with whatever corrections/additions they have added.

- We take the plans back to the architect to include the city's corrections/additions.
- We also take the plans to possible general contractors for their bids on the project.
- We select a general contractor and are finally able to provide a definitive overall cost for the entire Renovation project.
- We assemble a fund-raising team to determine the methodology for raising this amount of financing.

•We take the overall proposal to the church for its approval. We begin the project!

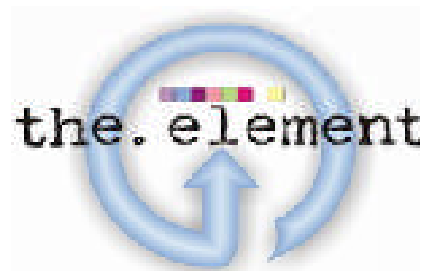

### All-Church Lenten Emphasis

The season of Lent is a wonderful opportunity to deepen your study of Scripture, and draw closer to the God who calls you by name. When we journey through these studies together, the effect is even more profound. For this reason, our Lenten Series are always designed to include the entire church body in a single, focused study. This year, in the weeks leading up to Easter, we will once again guide the entire family of God through a shared experience.

Our series for Lent 2008 is called "Outflow." The concept of "Outflow" is that as we draw closer to God and fill up spiritually with His love and grace, the result will be an outflow of that love and grace to the world around us. Our church vision is to become a church that plants churches. We will achieve this vision by becoming an outward-focused community, investing our lives in those who don't yet know Jesus. Outflow will further prepare us for our fulfillment of the Great Commission.
