Sanctuary Renovation Update

One of the new rear screen walls is up and operational now. We tested the rear screen projection out on Easter Sunday and the image was clear and colorful. We took down the old screen from the other side and put an Easter banner in its place for the Easter worship service. We are still working on issues with blocking the light and airflow from the attic area and keeping those issues from interfering with the screen.





Adam Burdick has started tearing down the wall on other side of the stage to start building the second screen wall. As part of that job we will be removing the staircase that currently provides access from the Sanctuary into the office. To replace that access, we will be adding a door on the floor level next to the west side double doors that will provide direct entry from the sanctuary into the workroom.

Mike Depew has been working hard on the demolition of the front stage stairs and the re-pouring of the concrete under that area for the new stage. Ken Harrell and John Pusateri have been helping Mike with that project.

Lloyd Darknell has been working behind the scenes on the electrical system as we are still moving circuits to accommodate the new stage.

For People on the Grow

Are You Crazy?!

For our Lenten series, we followed the book *Crazy Love*, in which Francis Chan encourages readers to grasp who God really is, how He loves us (with a "crazy love"), and how we should respond to His love. So what did you think of the book? Did it challenge you? Inspire you? Did it make you feel guilty? Did it make you angry?

I've heard all those reactions from brothers and sisters here at SCFBC, which tells me that we have a great discussion going! One thing must be clear—books by Christian authors can be excellent teaching tools, and God can speak through these authors in amazing ways. But the books themselves are not Scripture, and what we take away from them must be weighed in light of God's word.

Is Chan unrealistic?

Controversy seems to arise from Chan's final part of the book, where he recounts people who have responded to God's call in dramatic ways. They have sold their houses, gone on foreign missions, or quit their jobs to start new ministries.

I don't know about you, but when I read those kinds of stories, I want to run and hide! "I could never do that!" I tell myself. Some people might even dismiss Chan as ridiculous, and resent the implication that we should respond that manner.

Pastor Rich made an important comment about this to the Thursday evening Apprentice Study: "Chan spends much of book challenging us to break free of legalism and love God with abandon. But he comes a bit close to slipping into legalism himself by implying that nothing short of a dramatic, life-altering response will lead to God being pleased with us."

So what should we take away?

Chan's challenge to love and respond to God with utter abandon is one that each one of us needs to ponder carefully. Perhaps God does want you to make a radical life change; that will be one of the biggest blessings of your life, and our church family should celebrate that kind of obedience!

With all your heart you must trust the LORD and not your own judgment. Always let him lead you, and he will clear the road for you to follow.

~Prov. 3:5-6

To me, the only wrong response is to not respond at all. If you are worried or annoyed with what you perceive as unrealistic expectations, then try setting your feelings aside for now and ask God what he wants from you today. Maybe He simply wants you to hold your possessions loosely with an open hand, instead of a tight fist.

Rather than saying, "Nope, I'm not selling my house and moving to Africa!" try saying this: "What is in front of me today—right now—that I can do for you Lord, because I really do love you like crazy!"

Person of Interest

Denise Stephens and her husband, Jess, came to Santa Clara First Baptist Church in fall of 1987, looking for a Baptist church that would have youth programs for Denise's 17 year old stepson, James. Although James did not remain at SCFBC, Denise and Jess and their son Matthew later joined the church. Here at SCFBC, Denise has taken on a variety of ministry roles including multiple terms as Deacon of Finance and Deacon of Maturity, member of the Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC), small group leader, Vacation Bible School coordinator, children's and adult Sunday school teacher, and nursery volunteer.. Here's Denise's story in her own words:

Frankly, the church role that took the most work and was the most personally fulfilling to me was that as leader of a small group Bible study for women. In that role, I think I grew the most spiritually and was able to give the most to others. Preparing to lead a study on a weekly basis was work; but it pushed me to get into the Bible, to read it, to study it and to be able to make it applicable to the lives of the group members.

I had experienced teaching Sunday School since I was in elementary school, as my mother coordinated the church nursery and I spent many hours working in that ministry, especially teaching the three year olds. But I have to thank Susi Reaves for her influence that first got me involved in a SCFBC Saturday women's Bible study. After a while she asked me to lead individual lessons and then I branched out to be the leader of a separate group. I give that example because it is an example of what I believe: God guides our lives and even as we don't see where He is directing us, He is using our life experiences to prepare us to be the people He wants us to be and to do the work that He wants us to do, even when we drag our feet at times!

A thumbnail history of my life: My father was in the Marine Corps and consequently we lived in Oceanside, California (outside Camp Pendleton); Jacksonville, North Carolina (outside Camp Lejeune); and Willingboro, New Jersey. I became a Christian when I was seven years old, the same time my father became a Christian while he was on a year's "tour of duty" in Okinawa, Japan. I graduated from Oceanside High School and then from UCLA, where I double majored in Political Science: International Relations and Spanish. My first international experience was studying at the University of Madrid, Spain, and then traveling in Europe. I completed a Certificate in Teaching English as a Second Language and earned my teaching credentials during post-graduate work at UCLA. I began my teaching career in a bilingual second grade class in East Los Angeles while working on my Masters' Degree in Urban Education from Cal State University, Los Angeles.

In 1984, Jess and I were married in a ceremony officiated by Pastor John Ortberg, our Singles Pastor at La Crescenta First Baptist Church. We soon moved to Northern California. Here I have been blessed with two wonderful sons, Matthew and Jon-Michael, and have served in educational administration, including positions as principal of four different schools. I now am retiring from education and look forward to the different roles and challenges that God has in store for me in the coming years.
