Your continued support and prayers are greatly appreciated as we seek God's direction for our children.



As my kids, Carmen and Camille started middle school, the worry and fear about how they will handle the next few years has begun to grow. I began to seek out books and conferences regarding these years and I have come across some books that have really opened my eyes to what our kids are feeling and going through. I was so moved by this information that I have decided to invite all of you to a "book club"/ discussion group of sorts. We will meet at Santa Clara First Baptist Church in the Parlor off the Narthex on Sunday mornings at 9:15 beginning April 6th. There are classes and group activities for children and youth during this time.

Dr. Chap Clark, a professor and researcher at Fuller Theological Seminary, has written a book called "Hurt: Inside the World of Today's Teenager" based on his research with teens. He has found that across the board, teens feel pressured, hurt and abandoned by society. We will talk about what our kids are feeling and going through, how they view the world and how we can respond as adults who care. Dr. Clark has written a follow-up book called "Disconnected: Parenting Teens in a MySpace World" which is also a great book that we can discuss if you're interested in continuing.


