Annual Report, Senior Pastor

The year 2005 concluded my 14th year as the senior pastor of SCFBC. It's hard to believe we been together for such an extended ministry season!

Because of our church's generous personnel policy I was given a three month sabbatical during the year. (It comes every seventh year) Susi and I used the time to travel by car across this great country of ours, to participate in our son Andrew's graduation from the US Naval Academy, and to visit family and friends throughout our travels. It was an effective time of refreshment.

It was also a time for reflection and preparation. I visited a number of churches in our valley and across the country. I participated in a worship conference at Willow Creek Community Church outside of Chicago. Observing how others do ministry was insightful. I returned to work with a fresh perspective and increased energy for the tasks at hand.

Our church was ably led during the sabbatical by our Associate Pastor, Jennifer Hammar. She demonstrated increased ministry capabilities and handled a number of pastoral responsibilities very well.

Because of this and the changing demands of our church's ministries, we chose as a church to move Pastor Jenny out of Children's ministry and increase her pastoral duties in our AM and EDGE worship services. She now oversees both the children and youth ministries and is now the de facto pastor of our EDGE congregation.

Our Transition Team took over the responsibility for our church's vision this past year. For two years an Envisioning Team had been formulating the future direction of SCFBC. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit we determined to become a church that reproduces itself by planting a daughter congregation within a ten year period of time.

The Transition Team is now working to implement this vision. Its members are Joan Friesen (Outreach catalyst), Susi Reaves (Leadership catalyst), Lisa Robinson (Publicity/Involvement catalyst), Steve McLenegan (Diaconate Chairman), Greg Robbins (Diaconate Vice Chairman). Together we will continue to keep the fires of our vision burning hot in the minds and hearts of our members.

We also have a Renovation Team working to refurbish and update our Sanctuary, Parlor and Narthex. With our worship center showing its age of 35 years, it's time to bring a more up to date look and improved audio/visual capabilities. An architect has been hired and is now drawing up the needed plans. Soon we'll be able to show you all these improvements.

I look forward to another year of serving together with you in the greatest cause on earth. God has chosen throughout the centuries to use the local church as His key agent to advance the Kingdom. May we look to Him alone for all the wisdom and resource this great work requires.

Annual Report, Associate Pastor

Five years ago I was hired by Santa Clara First Baptist Church as a part-time Children's Pastor. This year has seen a major shift in my role and responsibilities at this church. In August I officially stepped down as Children's Pastor, and assumed a new role as Associate Pastor, with most of my time going to the leadership of EDGE. Marlies and I spent the Spring and Summer months working together, as she learned the ropes in children's ministry, and what was involved in the job.

Through the generosity of EDGE and the AM service, we were able to collect and deliver clothes, presents, gas cards, Safeway cards, household items and toys to 5 needy families in our neighborhood. This outreach ministry really opened our eyes to the tremendous needs right here in our area.

I so enjoy serving here at SCFBC. I am full of gratitude for the support and encouragement I receive from this congregation. You are a joy to be with, and a joy to serve.

Annual Report, Membership

Fellowship Fund:

This fund has helped people with purchasing prescriptions, eyeglasses, family counseling, utilities, rent and motels. The amount spent to assist our church family or people from the community was \$3205.00. Also we have a Food Pantry to help feed families from our church and community. To keep it stocked, we spent \$645.00, representing 181 bags of food. Volunteers for the "Pantry" are Harold Trathen and Maxine Cintas. Good Samaritan Ministry:

This ministry involves many volunteers and is co-coordinated by Maxine Cintas. Two families were helped on a regular basis to relieve caregivers so they could go to Doctors appointments, shop and take care of personal business. Other shut-ins were helped by picking up prescriptions and groceries, providing rides for doctors appointments, making deliveries, helping with cleaning and other chores around their homes. Comments:

When compiling the budget for 2005, it was anticipated we would need to pull from the surplus from previous years. However, once again giving exceeded income. We ended the year with a net income of \$46,273. This was \$38,523 over the budget.

We will not be doing a traditional stewardship drive for 2006. Although we are in the planning stages of a sanctuary renovation, we are again placing our trust in the Lord to continue to provide for the needs of Santa Clara First Baptist Church.

Annual Report, Maturity

2005 was a year of encouraging growth for adult Maturity at SCFBC. The highlight was a Lent emphasis entitled "The Life You Have Always Wanted", written by John Ortberg while at Willow Creek. It focused on applying what we already knew to enriching our spiritual lives. Many people participated and there have been signs of renewed and increased spiritual life since.

Two new nurture groups (also known as home Bible Studies) formed, by splitting as their 'parent' had grown too large. Other groups continue to thrive, despite practical difficulties for one or more of members, which gave opportunities for caring which in turn increased the bonds within the group.

Two Sunday Schools continued for most of the year (other groups are more accurately nurture groups even if they meet at church).

An experiment was tried with Introduction to Maturity, one of the "Introduction to" series, formerly held in a 2 hour session on Sunday afternoon - instead it was taught as a Sunday School class over 7 weeks - and appeared to be much more helpful to the participants. The content was practical instruction in the basic Christian disciplines of prayer, Bible study, obedience, the Holy Spirit, sharing your faith, stewardship and membership of the body of Christ.

Annual Report, Missions

In 2005 the Mission Department continued to build on many of the programs and outreach opportunities we had begun the year prior.

We once again coordinated (along with Ministry Department) a Ministry and Mission Fair as part of our Lenten emphasis. This allowed SCFBC attendees to chat with local mission organizations and learn how they can become involved.

We also sent another team to partner in ministry with our sister church, New Hope Baptist in Limon, Costa Rica. This year's team members were: Natalie Ferry, Karen Fong, Coy and Tracey Lindsay, Wim Mauldin, Jay Nordgaard, Joan Friesen, and Joel and Lisa Robinson. This was our fifth opportunity to share in the ministry in Limon by working at the elementary school operated by the church. The team dug ditches for water runoff, dug a ditch for a retaining wall, shared in the classrooms and did lots of painting. The team also participated in New Hope's Sunday School and Sunday worship hour as well as its mid-week Prayer Service. The host families were very gracious and we look forward to more opportunities to share with our Costa Rican brothers and sisters.

SCFBC continued its outreach to our local community by serving breakfast the first Saturday of each month at the EHC LifeBuilders' Boccardo Reception Center in San Jose. Two teams of SC bowlers also took to the lanes to support the organization's Home on the Lanes bowl-a-thon fundraiser. Additionally, the EDGE worship team shared their gift of music with guests at LifeBuilders' emergency cold weather shelter in Sunnyvale.

Thank you to all of you who once again gave generously toward programs to spread the Gospel of Christ and provide relief to those that fell victim to the year's many devastating storms. We received more than \$54,000 to support God's work locally, nationally and internationally.
