






Facilities

Our Facilities consist of:

- 3.3 Acres of Land
- A recently renovated Sanctuary that seats 330 people comfortably and up to 638 (Standing Room Only) for occasional special events
- A Children's Ministry Wing with up to 9 classrooms and two resource rooms
- A youth room divided into two areas
- Five adult classrooms
- A kitchen with an indoor dining area for up to 326 people.
 This Fellowship Hall can also be used for up to 700 people for occasional special events.
- Parking for 122 vehicles, with additional street parking available.
- One large storage building of 1736 square feet






Financials

The figure to the right shows Income versus expenses for the past 10 years at SCFBC. In every year except two, our expenses were less than income.

SCFBC has Available Funds in the form of \$109,000 cash and \$226,000 reserves (\$335,000 total).

SCFBC has Long Term Debt of \$0, as the entire campus is owned.

In 2009, we undertook a four year capital campaign to refresh the interior of our sanctuary, lobby, parlor and primary restrooms. People had been giving to this campaign in the form of donations since 2005. As part of the




campaign, over \$370,000 was generated in a four year period, with a total given to this project of \$522,760.

In late 2013, we began a campaign to repaint the exterior of the church campus. In a 3 month period, a total of nearly \$38,000 was generated to pay for not only the planned sanctuary painting, but the rest of the campus as well.



Our Congregation

SCFBC has 235 regular attenders. The figures below show our Congregation Demographics for adults. Our congregation, as expected, is made up predominantly of Caucasians, Asians, Hispanics. About 58% of our church is female, with a varied mix in age. While most of our attenders live in Santa Clara as expected, our church draws from the nearby cities of the Silicon Valley.





Worship

The worship at SCFBC can be described as modern, with occasional themed services and occasional hymns mixed in. Favorites include songs from Hillsong, Chris Tomlin, David Crowder Band, and other contemporary Christian artists.





Our Ministries

SCFBC provides meaningful ministry opportunities for all, ranging from our nursery ministry all the way to our senior adult ministry. Our children's ministry hour is currently coordinated by Jon Hammar. Volunteer teachers lead programs for children age nursery through grade five during the Sunday School hour.



Our youth ministry also has a Sunday School class during the Sunday School hour, and meets Wednesday nights throughout the year. Our youth ministry is led by Andrew Wong (High School Coordinator) and Jerry Cintas (Jr. High Coordinator). This entire ministry is volunteer led.

Our college/career ministry meets Tuesday nights as part of our Life Group ministry.

Our women's ministry has several ABW circles that meet monthly, as well as a thriving quilt ministry that provides prayer quilts for those in need.

Our men's ministry meets Sunday mornings during the Sunday School hour, as well as throughout the year for either monthly breakfast or grills.

All adults are highly encouraged to participate in a Life Group, which are held throughout the week. These groups range from bible studies to interest groups.

In addition to ministries for various stages of one's personal life, we also support the life of our church and community. Volunteers serve in the worship band and on the tech team that runs the slides, sound, lights during the service. Volunteers also serve as part of the Manna team, a group that prepares meals for our quarterly church meetings. SCFBC coordinates volleyball and softball teams for competition in an inter-church league.

Every year, SCFBC re-enacts the Christmas story for our community. This event, *Bethlehem*, is the South Bay's largest outdoor performance of the Christmas story. More information is available at: http://www.bethlehemsc.com.

Additionally, our church serves as weekly host to a Boy Scout Troop.









Missions

SCFBC has a strong commitment to missions - internationally, nationally and locally. We serve by the sharing of our tithes, talents and time.



Through our relationship with American Baptist International Missions we directly support the work of missionaries serving around the world. We also take four missions-focused offerings each year (One Great Hour of Sharing, World Mission Offering, America for Christ and Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering) in addition to special offerings for love gifts to support short-term missionaries our church sends out directly.

Our congregation sends teams out nationally to serve in times of disaster, and has developed an ongoing relationship with two

ministries in Mexico where teams serve regularly by assisting with building projects and coordinating outreach events such as Vacation Bible School.

Locally, SCFBC reaches out to those that need to know Jesus by (1) hosting a small food pantry and giving cupboard for those in need and (2) partnering with a number of non-profit organizations both financially and through volunteer hours. Some of these organizations include:
